1. Welcome

David welcomed everyone to the meeting. Daren led a karakia to open the meeting.

4. Matters arising from the minutes

5. Ngaio Reserve

Richard and Stephen Richards provided an update on progress. They met last Friday and the project is on track. Scope has been sent to tenders admin for GETS. This will be a two week process.

They are awaiting a response from the Heritage New Zealand application which is expected early October.

Currently working on the bike rack and dinghy storage designs. These will take 6 to 8 weeks to construct.

It is a sensitive site and discussions are ongoing with contractors regarding removal of large areas of concrete.

The schedule is very tight with a best case scenario of completion in December.

If artefacts or remains were found there would be a requirement to develop records or a process of reinternment.

Authority to proceed is not yet certain and conditions may be imposed. Weather could also extend project timing.

Contractors propose starting behind the Golden Bear and work forward. Phase 3 would be Tasman Sea Scouts area and Jellyfish area. Tasman Sea Scouts will be having sessions once or twice a week over summer. At least one of the bollards will need to be removed.

Mark advised that he had given landowner permission on an agreed area for the Golden Bear music festival. This is the concrete hardstand area adjacent to the GB. It was recommended that it should be documented that it could be compromised due to the reserve works.

The group view is that the festival should go ahead subject to it being constrained to the concrete area and it is noted that this area will be designated as an "Alcohol Free Zone" following creation of the reserve (as noted in the Masterplan).

The group was also unanimous in its view that egress should be for fire compliance only.

Martyn Barlow asked about 10am – 7pm closure of the commercial area – this will be discussed at a later meeting.
