The Adventures of Robin Hood

1930 // 102 mins // G // In this classic original version of Robin Hood, the charismatic Errol Flynn is Sir Robin of Locksley. With his band of Merry Men, he robs from the rich, gives to the poor and still has time to woo the lovely Maid Marian (Olivia de Havilland), and keep the nefarious Prince John off the throne.

Paddington

2014 // 95 mins // PG // A young Peruvian bear with a passion for all things British travels to London in search of a home. Hilarious chaos ensues!

Miracle on 34th Street

1947 // 96 mins // G // A truly wonderful family Christmas movie where realist Doris Walker (Maureen O'Hara) and her daughter Susan (Natalie Wood), who don't believe in fairy tales, are forced to re-examine their beliefs when they meet a man who claims to be the real Santa Claus.



Jailhouse Rock

1957 // 96 mins // PG // An iconic musical featuring the great Elvis Presley as young Vince Everett who, after serving time for manslaughter, becomes a teenage rock star.

Romeo and Juliet

1968 // 138 mins // PG // Shakespeare's classic tale of star-crossed lovers is brought to the screen in this stunning adaptation, directed by Franco Zeffirelli. Starring Olivia Hussey as Juliet and Leonard Whiting as Romeo.

Hunt for the Wilderpeople

2016 // 101 mins // PG // Ricky (Julian Dennison) is fostered by Bella (Rima Te Wiata) and Hector (Sam Neill) but all does not go to plan and Ricky and Hector end up the subjects of a national manhunt. A wonderful mix of heart and hilarity, kiwi style!

1969 // 99 mins // PG // The classic gold heist movie, with the best mini car chase in cinema history, peppered with the attitudes and innuendo of 1969! Starring Michael Caine, Benny Hill and Noël Coward.

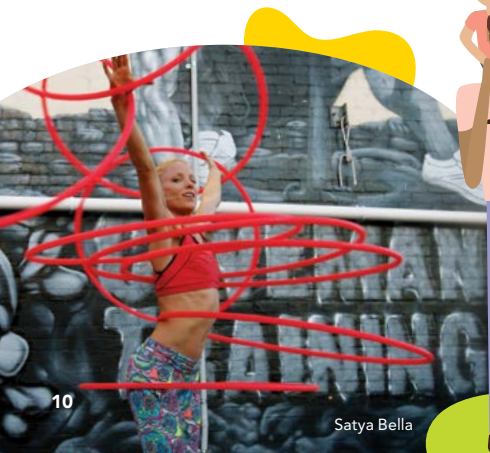

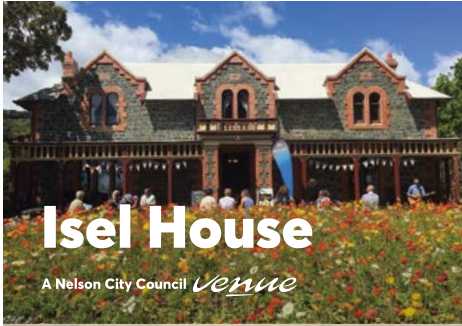

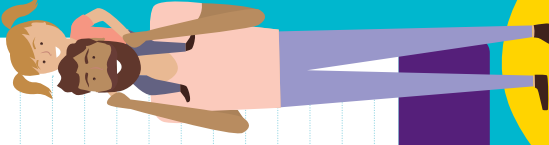
