Proposed changes to NPSFM

- NOF changes proposing new attributes for:
 - Sediment
 - Temperature
 - Benthic cyanobacteria
 - Wetlands
 - Potentially Macroinvertebrate Community Index
- Using Macroinvertebrate Community Index (MCI) as mandatory method of monitoring Ecosystem Health
- Also new attributes planned for
 - Water supply
 - Fishing
 - Cultural indictors

Proposed changes to NPSFM

- Requirement to maintain or improve 'overall' water quality to apply to FMU, not region
 - Attributes can be managed within a grade
 - Retains 'unders and overs' approach
 - Unclear on how this relates to case law at this stage
 - See Ngāti Kahungunu Iwi Inc v Hawke's Bay Regional Council [2015] NZEnvC 50
- Good management practice standards required where allocation discharge allowances are set and catchments approaching or at full allocation
- Stock exclusion requirement (see next slide for details and Takaka map)

Stock exclusion

- Requirement for stock exclusion
- Applies on land less than 15° slopes
- Applies to dairy and beef cattle, deer and pigs
- Does not apply to sheep or goats

• Timing:

- Dairy cattle & pigs by July 2017
- Dairy support by 2020 or 2025
- Beef & Deer on <3° by 2025
- Beef & Deer on 4-15° by 2030
