Thorp Bush Playground Upgrade – Youth Councillor

Councillor Walker spoke to the item and told the Board that the Youth Council were unhappy with the quality of work and agreed to follow up with staff.

Staff Response:

I have liaised with contacts of the Youth Council during this project, keeping them up to date with progress and issues. I have assumed that the Youth Council were aware that TDC staff have raised the poor paint job with Nelmac and this will be rectified when the plastic components are fitted.

Currently, this is likely to be approximately 3-4 weeks as we are still waiting on the plastic domes to be shipped.

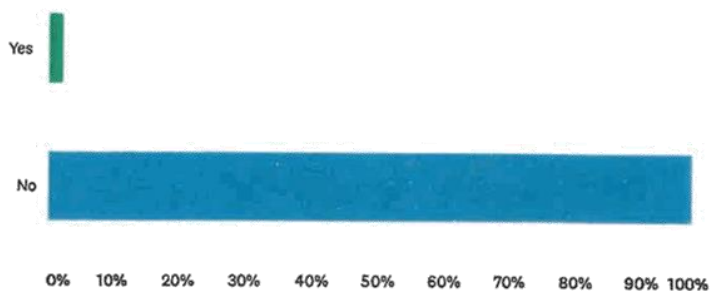
As of 27 April, the slide has arrived, but the other parts need to be made to order and there is quite a lead time for this. The component installation and painting patch-up will all be done at the same time. Nelmac estimate the job will be completed by 30 May 2021. No payment will be made until the work has been completed to a satisfactory standard.

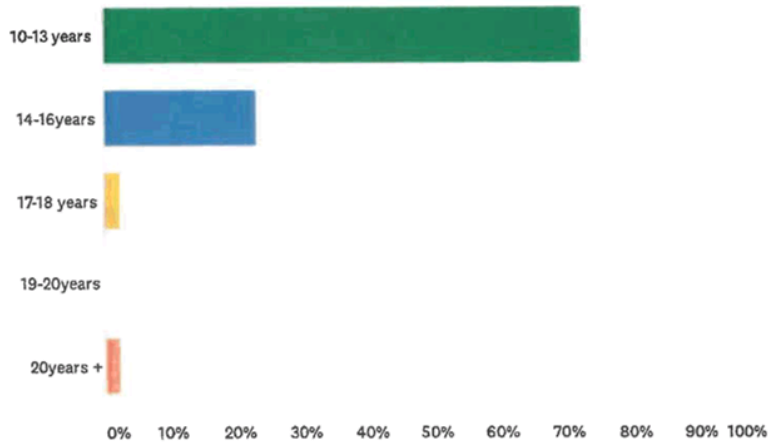

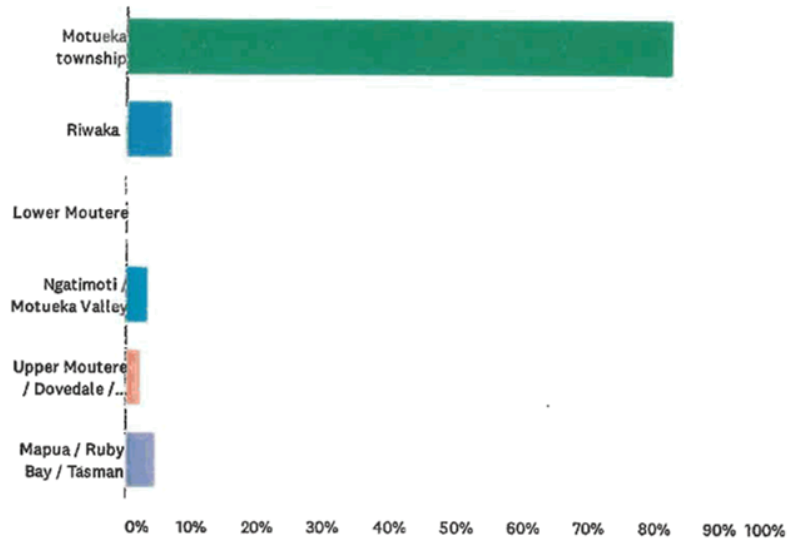

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS UPDATE REPORT – 13 MAY 2021

1. Summary

- 1.1 This report provides the Motueka Community Board with an update on some of the key highlights of the Community Development Department's operational work on our approved work programmes since our last report at the 1 April 2021 Operations Committee meeting. This report covers the work undertaken by the Reserves and Facilities and Libraries section of the Community Development Department.

2. Reserves and Facilities Update – Richard Hollier

Capital Programme Update

- 2.1 The table below contains the key projects and activities that occurred in Council's reserves and facilities since the last Operations Committee meeting in April 2021.

3. Libraries Update – Glennis Coote

- 3.1 This is an update of the Libraries activities from 1 February 2021 to 30 April 2021.

Events and Programmes

- 3.2 During the last three months, our Kotahitanga Cloak was on display at libraries across the District. The cloak was the result of a project during the Christmas school holiday period in which we encouraged library visitors to decorate a paper feather with words or symbols relating to kotahitanga, unity and togetherness, for Waitangi Day.



Kotahitanga Cloak at Richmond Library

- 1.1 Our 1000 Books Before School programme launched in Richmond, Takaka and Murchison in February. The programme aims to encourage parents and caregivers to read aloud to children from birth. By the end of April, 143 children from the Richmond, Motueka and Murchison areas had enrolled in the programme. The programme was developed by Motueka Library staff in partnership with the Motueka Family Service

Centre. More than 500 children have enrolled in the programme since it was launched in Motueka in November 2017.

- 1.2 Law for Lunch, a programme of lunchtime talks about legal issues, took place in Motueka and Richmond during March and April. Kaye Lawrence from Nelson Bays Community Law Service presented the talks, which covered a range of topics including Power of Attorney, trusts, wills and residential tenancy.

New Zealand Libraries Partnership Programme Funding

- 1.3 We have established a number of new initiatives with the funding received from the New Zealand Libraries Partnership Programme.
- 1.4 A project to record local oral histories and store these in our digital repository is underway. The new oral history collection is intended to be an online living archive of our local voices with a rich, highly representational range of Tasman District's voices, across all demographics.
- 1.5 As a first step we have reached out to Tasman's eight iwi to let them know about the project and to find out how the oral history collection could be of most use to them, so that we can make sure that the oral history collection is representational of and useful to iwi. The oral history collection will be representational and inclusive of the different stories of local iwi and people can contribute their story in te reo Māori or English.
- 1.6 Our new Pop-up library has visited events and places around the Tasman District. At the pop-up library, people can sign up and renew memberships, borrow books, learn about the library e-resources, events, activities and all the services our libraries have to offer. The Pop-up Library has been located at Children's Day at the Aquatic Centre, the Langford Store at Bainham, the Tiny House Expo in Motueka, Skatepark Girls' Takeover at Richmond Skatepark and the Richmond Council Office. Feedback has been extremely positive and since the launch in March, there have been 220 user engagements at the pop-up library.

- 1.7 We have expanded the range of digital skills training and assistance we provide. Our Digital Learning and Digitisation Specialist now runs regular free Digi Drop-In sessions at each of the four libraries. The sessions are open to users of all ages who need help with digital technology. We launched the service at the start of April, by the end of the month we had provided assistance for 34 people. Help topics included online banking, using library apps, help with setting up and using mobile devices, using Facebook and Messenger and using Zoom for online meetings
- 1.8 We have increased the level of support we provide for job seekers. We are working with Ministry of Social Development (MSD) and providers of employment support to identify individuals needing support with creating or updating CVs and doing online job applications. In conjunction with MSD we are organising job fairs to be held at the Motueka and Richmond Libraries in coming months.

Motueka Library project update

- 1.9 The project is progressing well and is currently ahead of schedule.
- 1.10 Installation of the roof and flashings have been completed. External framing is currently being completed and the installation of the support frame for the diaphragm ceiling is well advanced. Seismic bracing will be installed in early May followed by glass installation, which is scheduled to take six weeks.
- 1.11 We are working with our shelving suppliers on the shelving layout and work is progressing on the procurement of furniture and equipment and the storage of stock to transfer to the new library.

You may remember that we conducted a survey of residents last year to gauge the need for a footpath and footbridge along Motueka River West Bank Road, between old Mill Road and Mickell Road. The results of the survey showed that residents see the pathway and the bridge as a priority and the Motueka Community Board agreed, ranking the project a number one priority.

We are pleased to let you know that work will begin soon on construction of a shared pedestrian/cycle bridge alongside the Brooklyn Stream Bridge, and approximately 300 meters of shared pathway. The image over the page shows the route for the new pathway.

The 2.2m wide compacted gravel pathway will be constructed on Council owned road reserve, in front of the following properties:


Corner of Motueka River West Bank Road & Old Mill Road,

The Big Choices

CHOICE 1- Homes for our community

We ask Council to seek partnership with the current landowners and developers of the current **Motueka West development and advancement of that land as a higher priority**, but see that the Lower Moutere Hills (option 2) does provide an opportunity for residential property growth by utilising non-productive land that is not within the coastal inundation zone. However we would advocate that this is fully funded by any developer, with Council assisting with re-zoning only, (thus not incurring an additional \$30mil)

The Board advocate strongly for the protection of productive land, and prefer use of higher density housing on existing residential land, and for that housing to target a greater proportion of the lower-to medium-end of the market.

Tiny Homes and non-traditional housing solutions seem to be overlooked when looking at homes for our community within the current consultation document.

CHOICE 2- Waimea Community Dam

Option C – A targeted rate on all properties in the “Zone of Affiliation”.

The Board believe that Council has let the Motueka Community down. Council are *“not consulting on changing our original funding model or looking at alternative ways of paying for the urban water users and public good shares”*, which means that without any form of consultation the original district-wide rate of \$17 per property will increase to \$26 to a maximum of \$56 in 2023/24 without the proposed irrigators share of the additional costs. The reality is that due to projected costs to date this has already resulted in a \$30 per property increase to Motueka ratepayers!

Council promoted a P95 priced project. Likewise the estimated annual operating costs of the Dam (pg22 Revenue and Financing Policy) state that the original \$1.4-\$1.5mil is now being assumed at \$2.5 and \$3.1mil.

What we are hearing from our community is that they have lost confidence in Council’s ability to control cost, control Waimea Water Ltd of which Council is the major shareholder and to listen to and hear the concerns of residents throughout the district in relation to the WCD.

CHOICE 3 – A new Company model for Port Nelson and Nelson Airport

Traditionally merging / amalgamation of two entities too often does not result in savings to operations, however with this in mind the Board consider that **Option A** – Establish a single joint Company that combines Nelson Airport and Port Nelson is worthy of exploring.

CHOICE 4 – Responding to climate change

Option B: Balance of rate increase and is estimated at 2.5% increase. The WCD has pushed rates up and is now forcing under-investment in other key areas. Advancing active transport initiatives, supporting local warmer homes programme are all considered a priority by the Board, so we encourage Council to seek further partnership funding with Central Government funding to advance these priorities to minimise the increase to rates.

Proposed revenue and financing policy changes

Combine three existing facilities rates into two – Yes

The Board does not support funding some costs of selected rural water schemes partly through general rates will increase general rate per rating unit to \$6 per annum in 2023/24 and advocate that Option D is the fairest method of supporting these rural water schemes.

The Board support Option A where funding parts of activities (where there are multiple year benefits) through debt rather than rates.

Option A – Enabling Reserve Financial Contributions to be used for major renewals of reserves and community service asset, however in the Motueka Ward the Board strongly advocate the allocation of significant and earlier investment towards the Motueka Community Pool.

Motueka Community Pool

The Motueka Community and service providers have worked hard to build a pool for the Motueka Community. The history behinds this project dates back over 30 years. We applaud that Council have worked with the Motueka Pool Committee to secure a site on Council land. The Board, as does our community, consider progressing this project within year 2 a priority. The Board worry that the community support that has remained strong throughout for this project, maybe discouraged if faced with a further delay.

High Street – Streetscape following SH60 upgrade

We assume as previously indicated by Council staff that funding for the streetscaping of High Street Motueka is included in year 1 /2 of the current LTP, to commence soon after the roadwork improvements are complete.

Motueka wastewater

Acknowledge and support Motueka Growth – Waste Water infrastructure \$6mil Y1-3.

Land for new Motueka Wastewater Treatment Plant \$7.4mil Y8

Motueka Fire Fighting Rate

Currently \$17.88 is paid as the Motueka Fire Fighting Rate. The proposal to increase this to \$70.62 by 2023/24 is proposed without little detail other than seemingly increasing a “water rate” to all Motueka residents.

Parking deficit for Motueka

With the impending loss of 35 carparks from High Street, and an already stressed parking provision within a town that continues to see high tourist numbers (even throughout post-Covid), the Board strongly advocates for investigation for a new parking precinct to the West, especially in the area between the ends of Talbot and Manoy streets.
