Hello Michelle and fellow reps,

I have a couple of additions to go into the minutes;

- Debbie spoke about the "elephant in the room", being a replacement boat ramp on the south side of the
  Waterfront Park. Its acknowledged that this is discussed in the Mapua Area Waterfront Masterplan, but is
  not approved by TDC. However, we need to be aware of the Mapua Boat club and Tamaha Sea Scouts
  intention to continue with its proposal and we as a group need to be aware of these intentions and factor
  them into decisions we make.
- Clause 5. There needs to be another paragraph included, where Mark took it upon himself to verify the
  condition of any buried services in the area as well as ascertain whether or not they require upgrading etc
- Clause 5. I thought we wanted more rubbish/recycling bins for use by general public.... this is not mentioned anywhere?
- Clause 12. Re location of meetings. There was a general consensus to remain at the Mapua Boat Club unless there was a specific need to relocate. The group discussed the possibility of raising this again at next meeting, but what was the point, when we had just determined to stay at current location.
- Clause 9. There needs to be an action point for either Richard or Mark to accept the role of Deputy Chair
- Clause 10. Coastal News article. My recollection was that Martyn was going home that night to write an
  article and email back to David, to meet the very tight timeframes for the Dec/Jan issue. Am I wrong or did
  this happen and if so, could we please see a copy?
