Safe at the Top is a collaborative approach to improving community safety in Nelson/Tasman- using a tried and tested framework to align work, identify needs and gaps in provision and to maximise the resources available. The aim is to have Nelson / Tasman accredited as the 17th International Safer Community in New Zealand in 2011.

International Safe Communities is a World Health Organisation (WHO) concept that recognizes safety as "a universal concern and a responsibility for all".
