1 Summary

1.1 Chair's report for Corporate Services Committee meeting of 8 November 2012.

Audit Matters

- 3.1 The adoption of the Annual Report has again highlighted the excellent work done by Corporate Services staff in managing the complex financial side of Council's operations.
- 3.2 As a Council we run a relatively complex mixture of rates and charges, as well as using a significant amount of debt to fund our major capital expenditure. All of this means it is particularly important that the accounting side of Council operates effectively and efficiently.
- 3.3 A clean Audit opinion indicates that this task is undertaken well, that information provided is accurate and timely and that staff can satisfy the Auditors about the many queries that they no doubt have throughout the process.
- 3.4 My personal thanks to all the staff involved over what is a very busy time period with many long hours worked.
- 3.5 The audit has highlighted a significant improvement in our working capital position, largely due to obtaining longer term debt facilities that has also resulted in us finally gaining full compliance with our treasury policy which has been helped significantly with the advent of the Local Government Funding Agency (LGFA).
- 3.6 The key challenges coming out of the annual report relate specifically to depreciation and the funding of renewals/capital expenditure. It is expected this will be the subject of significant work prior to the next Long Term Plan.
- 3.7 The increase in shareholders in the LGFA, while reducing Council's shareholding, indicates a positive view from the wider sector over the benefits of this debt vehicle and reduces the risk to Council.

1 Summary

- 1.1 The Port Nelson Statement of Corporate Intent 2012/2013 was presented to the Joint Shareholders Committee for consideration at its meeting on 14 September 2012.
- 1.2 The Chairperson of the Board, along with the Chief Executive and Chief Commercial Officer, attended the meeting to answer questions about the proposed changes which were noted in the Chair's letter (attachment 2). The key changes referred to relate to performance indicators and targets.

2 Draft Resolution

That the Corporate Services Committee receives the Port Nelson Ltd Statement of Corporate Intent 2012-2013 Report RFN12-11-02, subject to it also being approved for signing by the Nelson City Council.

3 Purpose of the Report

3.1 To approve the Port Nelson Ltd Statement of Corporate Intent (SCI) for 2012/2013.

4 Background and Discussion

- 4.1 Port Nelson Ltd is required to complete an SCI by 30 June each year.
- 4.2 Although the attached SCI has been approved by the Joint Shareholders Committee, formal approval from this Committee is required.
- 4.3 After some discussion the following resolution was passed by the Joint Shareholders Committee on 14 September 2012.

Recommendation to Nelson City Council and Tasman District Council

<u>THAT</u> the Port Nelson Limited draft Statement of Corporate Intent for 2012/13 be approved for signing.

- 4.4 The key changes are in relation to performance indicators and targets which are outlined in the covering letter from the Chairperson, Mr Patterson (Attachment 2).
- 4.5 The Joint Shareholders Committee was satisfied that the changes were appropriate.

5 Financial considerations

5.1 The dividends contained within the SCI for 2012/2013 are in line with those contained within Council's budgets.

6 Options

6.1 Option 1:

Decline to approve the SCI and, along with suggested changes, refer the matter back to the Joint Shareholders Committee for further discussion.

6.2 Option 2:

Approve the SCI without change, subject to a similar resolution being passed by the Nelson City Council.

7 Significance

7.1 This matter is of relatively low significance in terms of Council's Policy on Significance, as it does not involve major financial expenditure and is not likely to have major public interest.

8 Conclusion

8.1 Given the detailed review by the Joint Shareholders Committee, the preferred option is that the Port Nelson SCI be approved for signing.

1 Summary

1.1 This report updates committee members on the New Zealand Local Government Funding Agency, Insurance, and the Commercial Committee.

2 Draft Resolution

That the Corporate Services Committee:

- a) receives the Corporate Services Manager's Report RCN12-11-12; and
- b) authorises the Chief Executive and the Corporate Services Manager to sign the required documentation to enable the pro-rata share sell down of shares in the second opening of the New Zealand Local Government Funding Agency.

3 Local Government Funding Agency

- 3.1 The annual report for the Local Government Funding agency (LGFA) has been received. If any members wish to obtain a copy please contact me directly.
- 3.2 Kapiti Coast District Council has recently been accepted as a guarantor which reduces the guarantee risk faced by councils as members of the LGFA.

4 Insurance

- 4.1 The Top of The South Insurance Collective (the collective), of which Council is a member, recently renegotiated its annual insurance cover.
- 4.2 The insurance market appears to have reacted favourably to the collaborative approach with increases in premiums for the collective being lower than that experienced by many other government organisations.
- 4.3 The New Zealand Local Authority Protection Programme (LAPP) continues to challenge most councils. LAPP in the short to medium term is now funded via a mixture of reinsurance and mutual self-insurance.
- 4.4 As previously discussed LAPP members' individual exposure equals five times their annual premiums and the total exposure for any one year is limited to ten times.
- 4.5 The LAPP premium for the 2012 year is \$195,500 plus GST with a new deductible of \$1.024.000.

- 4.6 In total, Council's insurance premiums are in line with budget.
- 4.7 Civic Assurance has recently provided their half yearly accounts to 30 June 2012.
- 4.8 Civic Assurance, for the first six months, suffered what was not an unexpected loss and expects to return to profitability once it is able to re-engage the insurance market in a more significant way. This is likely to occur once all of Civic Assurances reinsurers pay what is owed.
- 4.9 If any member wishes to obtain a copy of the half yearly accounts for Civic Assurance please contact me directly.

5 Appointment of non-elected Members to the Commercial Subcommittee

5.1 Fanselow Bell, a local recruitment agency, has been commissioned to assist in recruiting the three non-elected members for this committee. This process is expected to take approximately 8 weeks. Unfortunately, with the advent of Christmas, staff will not be in a position to bring any recommendations to you until the first meeting of this committee in the new year.

6 Local Government Funding Agency Share Second Opening

- 6.1 In accordance with the share agreement of the New Zealand Local Government Funding Agency Council has received notice that a second opening to become a shareholder of the LGFA will occur. The date for the second opening has been set for 29 November 2012.
- 6.2 The shareholder agreement requires existing shareholders to sell down shares to new shareholders on a pro-rata basis. This means that Council will be required to sell down 134,021 paid up shares and 134,021 unpaid shares.
- 6.3 The second opening will be taken up by a further 12 local authorities, making in total 30 local authority shareholders.
- 6.4 As Council's shareholding was acquired by the use of debt it is anticipated that the \$134,021 of share capital returned will be used to reduce the original loan.

1 Summary

- 1.1 The Council has received the latest determination from the Remuneration Authority (the Authority) who have laid out the revised rules in regard to an elected members ability to claim for vehicle running costs, travel time and allowances for communications.
- 1.2 Key changes by the Authority include:
 - 1.2.1 An amended threshold for mileage reimbursement that is now the lesser of a round trip from the members home to the council office or 30 kilometres,
 - 1.2.2 The reduction from 2 hours to 1 hour in travelling time before a travelling allowance would be paid
 - 1.2.3 Clarification that should a member receive a computer internet connection or ancillary equipment from the council the \$750.00 communication allowance will not be payable.
- 1.3 The determination from the authority takes effect from July 1 2012 and staff will be in contact with individual members to enable the back pay to be calculated. Given that detailed records may not necessarily have been kept a record of meeting attendance will suffice for the back pay calculation.

2 Draft Resolution

That the Corporate Services Committee receives the Remuneration Authority: Elected officials expenses and allowances Report RFN12-11-14.

3 Vehicle Mileage and Threshold Distance

- 3.1 The Authority has confirmed that for the 2012/2013 year the vehicle mileage allowance will remain at 74 cents for the first 5,000 kilometres and 35 cents per kilometre for any distance over 5,000 kilometres.
- 3.2 The Authority has indicated that this may be reviewed for the 2013/2014 year.
- 3.3 The Authority has made a change to the threshold distance that applies before a mileage claim can be made. The previous determination from the Authority meant that the first 30 kilometres in any one day was not eliqible for reimbursement.

3.4 The threshold has now changed to be the lesser of a round trip from the members home to the nearest council office or 30 kilometres. This may assist some members in being able to make a mileage claim.

4 Travel Time Allowance

4.1 The Authority, after receiving submission, will now allow a member on local authority business to claim a travel allowance of \$15 per hour for all travel that exceeds one hour. The Authority felt that the previous limit of two hours was to restrictive.

5 Communication allowance

- 5.1 The communication allowance clause has been clarified but essentially remains the same. If an elected member receives either a mobile phone, the use of a computer or ancillary equipment, or an internet connection, the current \$750.00 communication allowance is not payable.
- 5.2 A letter expressing concern will be written to the Authority in relation to the distribution of IPads to councillors.

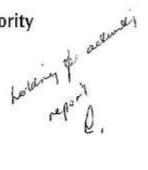

Elected officials expenses and allowances Local Government Elected Members (2012/13) (Certain Local Authorities) Determination 2012

The Authority has received a number of requests for clarification of the content and application of clauses 9-11 of the determination.

All three clauses are designed to provide some flexibility to councils to apply based on local circumstance, rather than having a prescribed rule for all councils. All three set maxima for allowances and councils maintain the ability to recommend that their expenses do not include such payments.

The Mileage Rate

Additionally the Authority has received enquiries related to the level of mileage reimbursement per kilometre. The Authority is aware of recent changes to the rate allowed by IRD for the purpose of submitting tax returns. The Authority will take this decision, along with any other changes that may occur, into consideration when setting the 2013/2014 determination but will not be adjusting the mileage rate in the 2012/2013 determination.

Vehicle Mileage - Clause 9

- 9 Vehicle mileage allowance
- A local authority may pay a member or a member of a community board a vehicle mileage allowance for travel by the member.
- (2) An allowance may be paid to a member under subclause (1) for each day within the period of this determination that—
 - (a) the member is not provided with a vehicle by the local authority; and
 - the distance travelled by the member on the day exceeds the threshold distance; and
 - (c) the member is travelling—
 - (i) in a private vehicle; and
 - (ii) on the local authority's business; and
 - (iii) taking the most direct route that is reasonable in the circumstances.

- (3) The allowance is payable, in relation to each day for which the member qualified under subclause (2),—
 - (a) in accordance with subclause (4); but
 - (b) only for the distance travelled on the day that exceeds the threshold distance.
- (4) The vehicle mileage allowance payable to a member is-
 - (a) no more than \$0.74 per kilometre for the first 5 000 kilometres for which the allowance is payable:
 - (b) no more than \$0.35 per kilometre for any distance over 5 000 kilometres for which the allowance is payable..
- (5) In this clause,—

on the local authority's husiness includes-

- (a) on the business of any community board of the local authority; and
- (b) travel to and from a member's residence to an office of the local authority or a community board

threshold distance means the shorter of the following distances:

- (a) the distance equivalent to a round trip between the member's residence and the nearest office of the local authority by the most direct route that is reasonable in the circumstances; and
- (b) 30 kilometres, if the distance equivalent to a round trip between the member's residence and the nearest office of the local authority is greater than 30 kilometres by the most direct route that is reasonable in the circumstances.

The amendments to this allowance clause are designed to allow the concept of 'travel from home to the council' to be applied with more flexibility. The effect is to allow for reimbursement to be made for mileage where the distance travelled is less than 30 kilometres and genuinely reflects travel to a recognised place of work.

Interpretation issues raised have been around:-

9(5)(b) travel to and from a member's residence to an office of the local authority or community board

This includes the main council office, a local hub to which councillors routinely travel to attend meetings or meet with staff over issues, the home base of a rural or suburban community board which it would be a reasonable expectation of a member that they will visit for business purposes. The expectation is that these premises would be well recognised locally as a permanent venue for district authority activity, and members would have an expectation that this be their 'place of work' for some or all council activity. Temporary areas where meetings might occur, such as local halls, libraries or hotels would not be recognised by this definition.

An example of the correct calculation of threshold distance is attached as Appendix 1.

Travel time allowance- Clause 10

- 10 Travel Time Allowance
- A local authority may pay a member or a member of a community board a travel time allowance if the office of the member cannot be properly regarded as a full-time position.

3

- (2) An allowance may be paid to a member under subclause (1) for each day within the period of this determination that—
 - (a) the member is travelling—
 - (i) on the local authority's business; and
 - (ii) by the quickest form of transport reasonable in the circumstances; and
 - (b) the travel time of the member exceeds I hour.
- (3) The allowance is payable, in relation to each day for which the member qualifies under subclause (2),—
 - (a) at no more than \$15 per hour; but
 - (b) only in respect of the travel for that day that exceeds 1 hour.
- (4) In this clause, on the local authority's business includes-
 - (a) on the business of any community board of the local authority; and
 - (b) travel to and from a member's residence to an office of the local authority or a community board.

This change recognises submissions made to the Authority that 2 hours as a threshold unreasonably penalised rural councillors and did not adequately reflect the distance that might be travelled by members to meetings.

Interpretation issues raised have been around:-

10(1) A local authority may pay a member or a member of a community board a travel time allowance if the office of the member cannot be properly regarded as a full-time position.

As you are aware members are self-employed, not employees, and the issue of hours of work is to a great extent driven by matters within the control of the council and the individual. Currently the Authority does not deem any councillor or local or community board positions as full-time. A number of mayoral positions are deemed to be full-time and if there are queries regarding whether your mayor/chair is deemed to be full-time these should be directed to this office. The expectation around hours of work may vary in the future and if this should occur it is likely that the Authority would explicitly identify this expectation to councils and communities.

4

Communications Allowance- Clause 11

11 Communications allowance

- A local authority may pay a communications allowance to members and members of its community boards for expenses relating to 1 or more of the following:
 - (a) a mobile telephone:
 - (b) a computer or ancillary equipment:
 - (c) an Internet connection.
- (2) The maximum amount of the allowance is \$750 for each member for the period of this determination.
- (3) However, the allowance is not payable to a member to the extent that the local authority provides him or her with 1 or more of the following:
 - (a) the use of a mobile telephone:
 - (b) the use of α computer and ancillary equipment:
 - (c) an Internet connection.

This clause was initially introduced to provide guidance to councils who wished to reduce administrative costs in reimbursing councillors who chose to utilise personal equipment in undertaking council business by paying an allowance, rather than reimbursing costs on an invoice basis.

The allowance is designed to cover the additional costs that councillors meet because of the duties they undertake as councillors. It is not designed to fully cover all costs members may meet.

The Authority and councils are confronted with an ever-changing suite of technology that can be used to maintain contact with council and constituents. Over the past decade usage of some technologies has become normalised (for example cell phone and broadband) whilst other technologies are no longer as prevalent (for example fax machines and land lines). The basis for the allowance needs to be adjusted accordingly.

Currently an increasing number of councils are considering, or have introduced, use of iPads or tablets for council papers and meetings. We are now receiving enquiries on the effect of that provision on the communication allowance.

The Authority believes that the suite of technologies available and required for council work, and the current cost of purchasing such services or equipment, requires careful assessment when determining the extent of any allowance that is made to councillors.

Generally, the Authority believes that at least 50% of the cost of the access to broadband and mobile networks is a normal cost against the councillor's personal income and the allowance should reimburse no more than the balance of those costs.

A question to be considered in providing, for example, an iPad or tablet to a member is whether other equipment or services are still needed by the member for council related

business. If all council business is conducted through the new technology the council should no longer be providing or subsidising a personal computer.

It is the whole suite of services, reimbursements and costs that should be considered in relation to the allowance, together with any personal benefit the member gains by the provision of the equipment.

Since the cost of equipment provided and services accessed varies widely there is not one answer the Authority can provide. If you wish to verify the communication calculation with the Authority, this can be done as part of the approval process for your expenses policy.

Appendix 1

A councillor lives 7 kilometres from the local council office in his/her ward, and 20 kilometres away from the main council office.

For the purposes of this calculation the distance to the nearest council office is 7 kilometres and the round trip 14 kilometres, the threshold travel distance is the shorter of 2x7 kilometres and 30 kilometres.

If the councillor attends meetings during the day that involve 58 kilometres of travel the reimbursable distance is 44 kilometres.

If a councillor only travels to the office no reimbursement is payable.

Had there not been a local office, the threshold of 30 kilometres would apply, and the councillor would be reimbursed 10 kilometres for a round trip to the council office and 28 kilometres if meetings during the day require 58 kilometres of travel.

It is expected that during this financial year total council debt will be managed within budget

3.2 New Swap Transactions

The Corporate Services Manager has delegated authority to enter into interest rate swaps on behalf of Council on the proviso that it is reported back to this Committee.

No new swaps have been entered into since the last report.

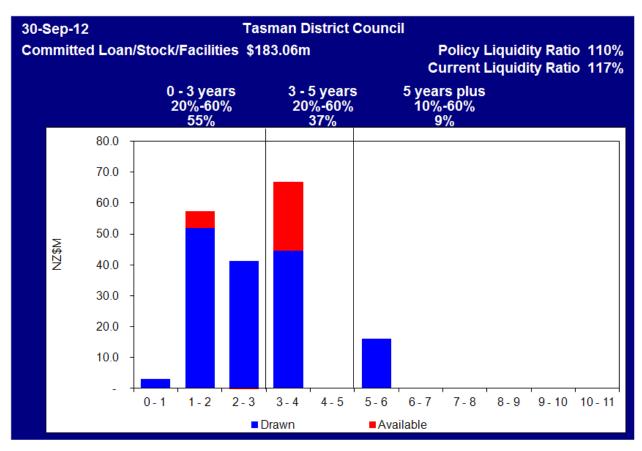

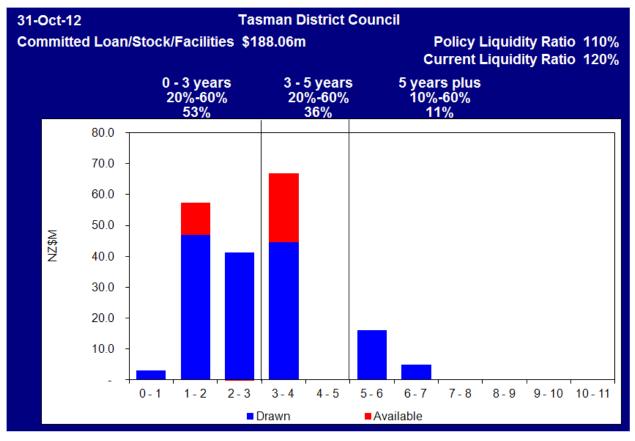
3.5 Facility Maturity Limit

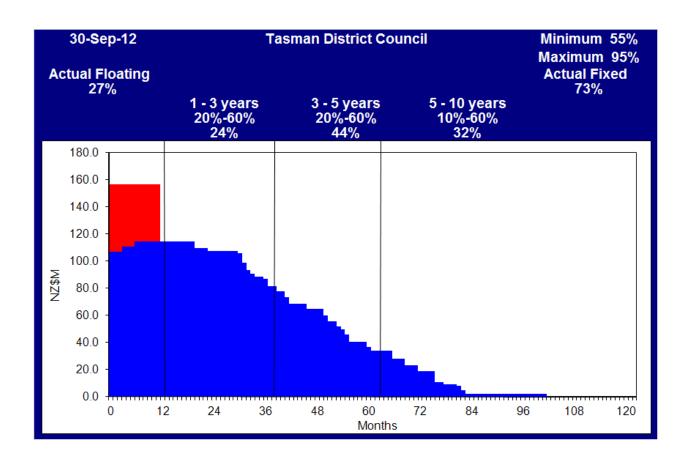

Financial Comment September 2012 (Interim)

The position detailed in this report is an interim result for September 2012, as at the time of writing not all expenditure for the month had been processed. At the highest consolidated level for the September interim position income is at 24% of budget, and expenditure at 25%, resulting in a net position of 6%. At the first quarter position the results reflect some of the vagaries of Council in that it is a collection of a large number of smaller business units with varying modes and timings of operations.

These comments should be read in conjunction with the Departmental Summary positions on the following pages:

- Vested Assets only \$12,000 has been received against a year to date of \$846,00
- Forestry operations have skewed the Council Enterprises summary, as early harvesting
 has taken place in Rabbit Island, resulting in both higher income and expenditure than
 currently budgeted.
- Cobb Valley Road contributions from Department of Conservation and Transpower, along with the Tasman Loop Cycleway grant have provided a positive variance to budget for Engineering Fees and Recoveries.
- The September Transfund claim has been estimated and will be finalised once all costs are processed, and is expected to increase from the initial position reported here.
- The timing of some income activities report a negative variance to budget, however this position will be corrected over the following months.
- Legal fee charges are higher than budget and are being reviewed.
- SPARC subsidies have been received ahead of budget

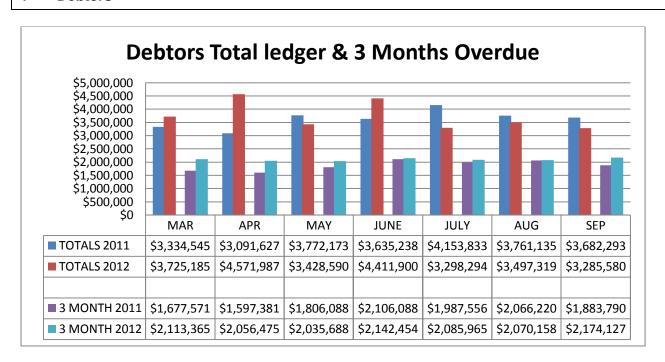

1 Summary

3 Motueka Aerodrome

3.1 The financial accounts for the Motueka Aerodrome to 30 September 2012 are attached to this report. At the first quarter point of the year income is slightly ahead of budget, whilst expenditure has a negative variance to budget. This position is largely the result of paying the full rates for the year in the first instalment, so is largely a timing variance for the year to date. The operation is trading at a deficit of just over \$3,000, however the account does contain a contribution towards general rates of just under \$3,000.

4 Port Tarakohe

- 4.1 The financial reports to 30 September 2012 are attached to this report. At the high level income is at 76% of budget for the first quarter, primarily the result of only 42% of the wharf income budget being received, however mussel line charges information has just been received and is not yet reflected in this report. This total of around \$18,000, would bring total income to around 89% of the budgeted year-to-date position. Expenditure is down minimally at 93% of the budgeted year-to-date position. The net result is a higher than budgeted deficit for the year to date.
- 4.2 The total capital works spend is currently only at 2% of the budgeted \$311,400.
- 4.3 The debtors total of \$201,400 includes those annual charges already invoiced, and is largely offset by the berthage in advance amount of \$143,837. This income is then accrued each month into the Profit and Loss Statement.

5

Forestry

- 5.1 The forestry accounts to 30 September 2012 are attached to this report.
- 5.2 The Quarterly Forestry Report and Quarterly Harvesting Report are also attached to this report.
- 5.3 The Forest Managers are required to report on a three monthly basis and will be present at the meeting to answer any questions.

Forest Operations

- 5.4 With 25% of the year gone, approximately 18% of the total annual budget has been spent.

 All areas planned for replanting have been completed and the spring rains have helped early growth.
- 5.5 Forest security at Rabbit Island remains a concern, especially going into the summer months. The Moturoa cycleway has nearly been completed and is proving popular. Some sections will require surfacing following recent harvesting.
- 5.6 Steps have been taken to improve health and safety compliance and signage at Rabbit Island.
- 5.7 Increasing activity among mountain bikers building illegal and unsafe jumps in Kingsland Forest is becoming a real concern.

Harvesting

- 5.8 Income is ahead of budget and the full year budget income should be realised.
- 5.9 Markets have been reasonably firm and export is holding up well. Access to local mills is becoming more competitive and Forest Stewardship Council certification is becoming more critical.
- 5.10 Production thinning of trees along Ken Beck Drive at Rabbit Island should improve the aesthetics of the main access way to the beach as well as allow the ornamentals more light.
- 5.11 The community firewood scheme ran well over the autumn months with plenty of public demand.

Rabbit Island Cpt 4/04 pruned quality has been good with few incidences of resin pockets. A lack of demand from South Pine meant a significant volume of pruned logs was sold to Westco based in Greymouth. This incurred higher cartage costs but these were offset partly by higher log prices.

The harvesting crew produced ahead of target in August which meant that the block was finished earlier than planned. A small block of production thinning in Cpt 8/04 is planned for October and once that is completed there will be no further harvesting at Rabbit Island until 1 April 2013.

1 Summary

1.1 This report is an update for the Corporate Services Committee on the latest activity and projects in the Information Services Section.

2 Draft Resolution

3 Broadband Update

3.1 The latest date for the Rural Broadband fibre connection into Takaka is mid-November 2012. From this date schools will be able to get connected via their Internet Service Provider (ISP) agreements. Businesses and home users within range of the Takaka Exchange will have to negotiate a move onto the fibre with their own ISPs. Snap, the Internet Provider for Tasman District Council has already placed a request for upgrading the Service Centre and Libraries at the earliest opportunity.

4 IPads Recommendation Report

- 4.1 The IPad Test Group continues to use the devices to access meeting documents and other Council information.
- 4.2 The Remuneration Authority has confirmed that provision of such devices will have an impact on Councillor remuneration for communications costs such as PC/broadband, fax and cellphone. In response the Corporate Services Manager is writing to the Remuneration Authority outlining the real cost benefits to the Council through the provision of IPads.
- 4.3 You will be advised once a response is received.

5 NCS New Developments

5.1 Attached to this report is an update on developments with the Council local government system from Napier Computer Systems (NCS) including a major upgrade and changes to budgeting and planning capabilities within the system.

6

Projects Update

- 6.1 IS staff connected up the new Richmond Office building to the network at the start of October and assisted with the move of Engineering, Community Services, Customer Services and Strategic Development during the weeks of 8 and 15 October. The move was completed with minimal disruption to services for the teams involved.
- 6.2 Golden Bay Service Centre Changes: The IS team are assisting with network, telephone and driver's licence requirements in the Golden Bay Service Centre as part of their shift into the back office.
- 6.3 Golden Bay Videoconferencing: while the equipment is now supplied, installation will depend on the outcome regarding the future of the Golden Bay Service Centre. Currently the meeting room is unavailable, however alternative locations are being considered.

NCS Update Report for Corporate Services Committee

Date: 29 October 2012

Introduction and Overview

To update the Corporate Services Committee on the current state of the Napier Computer Systems Local Government System (NCS) including new developments and functionality that will benefit Council, especially during future planning and Long Term Plan updates.

What is NCS

NCS is a suite of computer applications that cover many of the broad functions of Council such as

- Council finances
- Rating
- Building Consents
- Resource Consents
- Licensing
- Dogs

It is the key system that allows Council to fulfil our main functions and services. NCS is the most common local government system for small to medium size councils. NCS is a family owned business although they have expanded with a third party business partner in 2011. Council implemented NCS in 1992 and has worked with the company to ensure its systems have matured and developed to meet our needs up to 2012.

Pros of the NCS System up to 2012

- 1. It is a New Zealand system with excellent access to senior executives and ability to influence how the system develops.
- 2. It is closely aligned with New Zealand local government requirements. Changes to central and local government legislation are usually enacted quickly and without problems or for a high cost.
- 3. It is fully Web enabled meaning it is
 - a. simpler and easier to support
 - b. has no major or expensive hardware requirements
 - c. usable on a wide range of technology
 - d. easy to deploy online services to customers
- 4. It performs Council's core business functions, such as Rating, very well.

Cons of NCS System up to 2012

- 1. Investment into system research and development has been static in recent times.
- 2. It has been limited in its core application suite while other local government systems have provided more functionality and integration with applications such as GIS and document management.
- 3. It has had limited integration with applications for reporting, modelling and providing visual performance dashboards.
- 4. It has struggled to keep pace with new developments in Information Technology.
- 5. The user base has been static or shrinking in recent times.

Recent Changes to the Company

After several years of static growth, The owners of NCS reorganised the company with a new Director and CEO, Colin Peacock in 2011. Colin has updated NCS from the ground up, reorganising the structure of the company and branding of the system and forming a series of

strategic partnerships with creators of third party applications integrated into the system to allow NCS to provide a one stop shop local government information portal.

MagiQ Enterprise Version 3

The core of the newly updated system is called Magiq Enterprise 3 and this runs the main applications such as finance, rates and consents. This new version was launched in September 2012 and is available for councils to upgrade.



Key aspects of the new system include

- Portal functionality, allowing users to personalise their own screen view and applications depending on requirements.
- Live updating of data making it easier to show changes in addresses, finance data and other information immediately.
- Embedded applications for rich reporting and dashboarding.
- Self service and online application capability.
- Deeply embedded and supported partner applications for asset management, document management, budgeting and reporting.

Magig BR Budgeting and Reporting

Magiq BR is an enterprise budgeting, reporting and strategic planning tool that integrates with NCS modules such as Finance, Rates and Property. The key benefits of MagiqBR are

- 1. Improved information visibility and quality via a common, simple interface.
- 2. Improved budget input and management process.
- 3. Dashboard views of financial, planning and other information using graphs, charts and easy to use graphical formats.
- 4. A single data source giving 'One Version of the Truth' for all users.
- 5. A framework that supports user processes and improved decision making.
- 6. Visual indicators to assist management at a glance.
- 7. Corporate license to minimise maintenance and maximise return.



For Finance users

- Provides improved and integrated budgeting functionality.
- Automates and streamlines the current spread sheeting system to save significant time allowing proactive and positive planning.
- Provides easy access to financial information for analysis and reporting.

For general users

- One easy to use graphical interface.
- Provides visual alerts to keep the user updated in real time.
- Low skill level required for input and reporting.
- Customisable 'look and feel' to suit user requirement.

For Strategy and Planning

There is another module available in the Magiq BR suite called MagiqLTP and this allows draft Long Term Plans to be collated within the application to provide an electronic draft view using actual figures, charts and graphs to assist with the planning process.

Tasman District Council Approach

Magiq Enterprise 3 will be installed in test mode at Tasman District Council in December 2012. Testing will take place through to March 2013 when the new system will move into the live environment.

With regard to MagiqBR, as Council is at Year One of a new Long Term Plan (LTP) it is a good time implement this into the test system with a view to full implementation by the time work begins on the 2015 LTP. This would mean testing the MagiqBR functionality alongside the normal financial budgeting and modelling processes as part of Annual Plan 2013-2014. If expected improvements are seen, MagiqBR would be used to create the Annual Plan 2014-2015 and if no issues arise, Council would be in a good position to use it to create the 2015 LTP.

If significant problems arise as part of the test and implementation programme Council has the option of dropping MagiqBR as part of our suite of NCS applications as the programme is leased rather than owned by Council.

Council's current investment in NCS and the moderate cost of implementing MagiqBR make this a low risk solution, especially in comparison to both changing our local government system and implementing a new financial planning system.
