1. Welcome

3. Minutes of the previous meeting – 16 September 2019.

The minutes of the previous meeting held on 16 September 2019 were accepted as a true and accurate record.



4. Matters arising from the minutes

A question was raised about the timing of the underwater services connection.

Debbie Lavery asked whether carparks are to be marked out in the Grossi Point carpark.

Mark Johannsen reported that the ferry tender was being evaluated. He will report further at the next meeting.

He also reported on the Mapua water project.

5. Annual review of the Group

Tom Watkins provided an explanation of his review of the Group and members completed a short anonymous survey which he will report back on to the next meeting.

6. Ngaio Reserve design and implementation update.

Richard Hollier presented the works programme. The start of the works in April conflicted with the school holidays so this will be pushed back by a few weeks.

The Group agreed that Richard Hollier would provide a rolling itemised list of works within each six week period. It was agreed that the consultation would be more than the standard Tasman District Council approach as there is an opportunity to take a more influenced approach through our iwi group members.

Funding

- The MDC are prepared to raise \$10k for seating but want to investigate a cheaper way, e.g. High School woodworking class (Motueka High School, Waimea College were suggested). A question was raised whether there is a risk of multiple funding applications for similar projects in a similar location.
- RH mentioned that Council funding could be used for materials to spread community funding further.
- The MDBA is happy to give a lump sum but have asked the Group to identify a specific item they can fund.
- Tamaha Sea Scouts are happy to be part of community fundraising. The provision of a pou by iwi was raised but their preference is a wait and see approach at this stage.
- The MBC are happy to contribute and are in the process of applying for funds for the Port Māpua Maritime Museum and would need more information.
- Most of the organisations would require more information prior to committing fully.
- Stephen Richards is to send a draft of the Historic Places' Trust application to Naomi Aporo.



7. Grossi Point whiteboard session on timelines and strategies





Appendix 2: Grassed area new Mapua wharf. Email from Rob O'Grady – Project Manager, Engineering Services.

Progress has been slower than the contractor anticipated. This is due to a combination of factors including collapsing ground, high groundwater flows, contaminated ground at the wharf, and service clashes. These had been anticipated, but have proven to be more challenging than expected, particularly with respect to ground conditions. The contractor is excavating through river stones which are proving to be a challenging material to work with.

The contractor now plans to be fully completed and commissioned up as far as Langford Drive by the end of November. They will then demobilise from Aranui Rd and move up to Stafford Drive for the summer "Aranui Rd exclusion" period. They will return to Aranui Rd in mid-April, and will work on two fronts from then on to meet timeframes. One crew will work on Aranui Rd, and the other on Stafford Drive.

Please pass on our thanks to the community for their patience while the work progresses. Council and the contractor have appreciated everyone's willingness to work in with construction activities while we get the job done.

We will send out an updated stage plan within the next month to give residents and business's further guidance on where and when work will be occurring.
