- ENZA Foods owned by T&G. Due diligence is still underway on a potential sale of the operation we will be kept updated. Not running their juice plant. Will start their 'solids' line around 3rd April through to September a 24 hour operation.

 one shift required. Terry Kreft confirmed that he is retiring will inform us of his

 We need to collectively agree on a revised protocol to work within the conditions.
 Alan Jones said he would circulate the current list of contacts from the Contingency Response Procedures – for updating as required.

Agreed there is some urgency in updating our processes around this.
