4. NELSON TASMAN POSITIVE AGEING FORUM ELECTION OF CHAIR

One nomination was received by the current Chair Ruby Aberhart. As no other nominations were received, Ruby Aberhart was confirmed as elected uncontested.

Ruby acknowledged the help she had received from everyone in the Forum but especially help from Judene Edgar, Annette Nistor, Margaret Parfitt, Sue Tilby and Mike Tasman-Jones.

5. GOOD HOMES PROJECT UPDATE - Bronwyn White, NHMDB

Bronwyn White advised that she was working from the NHMDB. She outlined the 'Good Homes Tools' booklet and added that 900 had been printed. Bronwyn added that the booklet was currently being tested.

Bronwyn then outlined that a localised resource was required and a Link Chart recommended. Discussion on a cover sheet going out with each booklet giving localised information ensued.

Liam Butler (Support Works) suggested running a campaign to do a warrant of fitness on your own health and wellbeing.

Craig Piner (NZ Fire Service) recommended that the 'Home Safe' NZ Fire Service booklet go out with the Good Homes Tools booklet. These booklets are available from Craig – email craig.piner@fire.org.nz

Bronwyn requested ongoing feedback from members of the Forum on the Good Homes Tools booklet as the project roles out.

6. GOING DIGITAL TARGETED ASSISTANCE PACKAGE – Guy Burns, Going Digital

Guy Burns (Going Digital) advised that on 28 April 2013 analogue will be turned off leaving only digital signal for New Zealand TV's. A set top box at a cost of under \$100 will be required for older TV's to receive the digital signal. He added that new TV's have this built into them.

Guy advised that those who are eligible for assistance were outlined in the brochure provided at the meeting ie. the Government is offering a Targeted Assistance Package to people who have a TV and;

- Are 75 or over with a community services card; or
- Are receiving a Veteran's Pension; or
- Are receiving an Invalid's Benefit; or

• Are former recipients of the Veteran's Pension or Invalid's Benefit who converted to New Zealand superannuation at age 65.

It was advised that Murchison and St. Arnaud were going digital in 33 days time.

7. THE NCC PARKING AND VEHICLE CONTROL BYLAW - Margaret Parfitt, NCC
