1 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Cr Norriss updated the Committee on the meeting he attended with Mayor Kempthorne for chairs of regional land transport committees, mayors and regional land transport committee members.

3 TRANSPORTATION REPORT – MARCH 2009

Mr Thomson spoke to the report contained in the agenda.

Mr Thomson was asked to write a letter of thanks to Graeme Taylor for his input into the district's roading on behalf of the Engineering Services Committee.

The issues with late completion of customer service requests has been addressed with Fulton Hogan's regional manager and an undertaking given that performance will be improved.

It was noted that the steel work on the swing bridge at the confluence of the Graham needs painting.

Black Bridge reconstruction is near completion and an official opening will be held shortly.

The Walk and Cycle Five Year Action Plan will be developed as part of the new Regional Land Transport Strategy to be released publicly later this year. Motueka Community Board to be advised of this change.

There has been improved performance in terms of more work being carried out to get rivers work on track with annual work schedule. Advertising tender for rivers maintenance contract, due to start on 1 July 2009.

Cr Norriss asked that the crack willow issue be looked at. He agreed to doing the work while doing general maintenance, but not as a separate work.

4 LOW TRAFFIC ROAD SEALING POLICY REVIEW

Mr Thomson spoke to the report contained in the agenda which provided a review of Council's Low Traffic Road Sealing Policy with the intention of allowing for isolated seal extension sections of rural roads.

Cr King was concerned about the 500 metre restriction from the end of existing seal and didn't agree with requiring a 5 metre sealed road.

Mr Thomson said that was a fair point, and maybe 500 metres is too tough. You just don't want a road with short sections of gravel then seal, then gravel. Policy needs to allow discretion in its application. 200 metre minimum issue makes it expensive if only one house is affected, but it could go to 150 metres.

Cr Glover said the costing policy is too prescriptive and it is a large amount of money for one person to pay.

Cr Norriss said there should be some leniency in the policy for road width. It would be ridiculous to drive 500 metres up a road of 4 metres width and then have a section 5 metres wide.

Cr Ensor said the purpose is to alleviate a dust problem, but the cost is huge. He asked if forestry companies using these roads contribute?

Cr Norriss said they pay through road user charges and also contribute a share on occasions with bridge upgrading. This is a dust issue.

Mr Thomson said 5 metre road width makes for safer roads, and under its plans and standards Council doesn't allow developers to build roads below those standards. If doing upgrades he recommends doing them to a standard to meet approval of national agencies who provide subsidy.

5.1 Utilities Management Report

Mr Cuthbertson spoke to the report contained in the agenda.

Cr Bryant was concerned about having an effluent dump station in the resource centre and close to the estuary walkway.

Mr Cuthbertson said this facility will be parallel to the road and will be able to be policed as it will only be open during opening hours of the resource centre.

5.2 Stormwater and Water Capital Budgets

Mr Cuthbertson spoke to the report in the agenda that sought approval from the Engineering Services Committee to reallocate approved capital expenditure within the stormwater and water budgets.

- Road, Kingsley Place and Upper Gibbs Road can be undertaken in the 2008/2009 financial year;
- b) the Engineering Services Committee approves the reallocation of funding within the water account so that the works associated with Gladstone Road and Talbot Street can be undertaken in the 2008/2009 financial year;
- c) a further report will be presented to the May 2009 Engineering Services Committee to review the scope of the works proposed in Park Drive and Salisbury Road.

5.3 Takaka Fire Fighting Water Supply

Mr Cuthbertson spoke to the report contained in the agenda which identified the issues raised through the public submission process for the Takaka fire fighting water supply proposal and the haring held in Takaka on 10 March 2009.

- a) That the targeted rate for the Golden Bay Ward be increased from \$10 to 415 per property per annum for 20 years, with a corresponding decrease in the targeted rate in the Takaka CBD;
- b) That the Takaka CBD targeted rating area be amended by:
 - 1) Removing the farm lot from Motupipi Street;
 - 2) Including Waitapu Engineering and the camping ground;
 - 3) Including land adjacent to Reilly Street (western side);
 - 4) Extending the map to include properties on Commercial Street to Rose Road.
- c) That the Takaka residential targeted rating area be amended by:
 - 1) Removing 31 Willow Street as the land cannot be built on;
- 2) Including residential land on the north-eastern side of Meihana Street. CARRIED
