2. GROUNDWATER QUALITY OF COASTAL SETTLEMENTS, GOLDEN BAY - REPORT EP07/06/02

Resource Scientist, G Stevens, spoke to his report dated 31 May 2007, contained within the agenda.

Community Board Member, J Bell, joined the meeting at this time.

The report provided an assessment of the second survey of the water quality of residential water supplies in the coastal settlements of Golden Bay, undertaken during January/February 2007.

- d) Council staff to continue to monitor bathing water quality at the respective beaches fronting these communities during the summer months;

e) The Committee supports repeating this survey in five years time (eg, summer of 2011/2012) to enable trend assessment on the underlying groundwater quality and the adequacy or otherwise of the ongoing functioning of domestic wastewater systems in these areas.

3. INVESTIGATION INTO SIGNIFICANT NATURAL AREAS IN TASMAN DISTRICT - REPORT EP07/06/03

Policy Planner, L Vaughan, spoke to this report of 11 June 2007 contained within the agenda. The report provided an outline of the proposed investigation into significant areas. Attached to the report was a Memorandum of Understanding, prepared by the parties following the adoption of a signed agreement, associated with a consent memorandum. Mr Vaughan explained the proposed investigation process and the intended method of funding that work.

5. BUILDING CONTROL FEES - REPORT EP07/06/05

Mr Bush-King spoke to this report of 6 June 2007 contained within the agenda and the attached proposed amended building control charges. Mr Bush-King used the existing schedule of building consent fees to assist in the explanation and reasons for the proposed new charges.

Cr O'Regan questioned why this further increase in fees is required and asked about getting some money back from the Building Levy Fund.

Mr Bush-King said that there had been increased costs and additional staff required to meet the 2004 Building Act requirements and changes to the Building Code. He said local authorities must be accredited by 30 November 2007 and Council is still going through that process.

Policy Planner, N Jackson, spoke to his report dated 6 June 2007, regarding Government's proposed national policy statement on electricity transmission and he proposed two minor amendments to the policy statement. Mr Jackson asked the Committee to note an amendment to policy 3, page 7 of his report so that the word "any" on the third line, be deleted.

Or, if councils have any role in giving effect to it:

Replace Policy 2 with:

"The electricity transmission network should be operated, maintained, upgraded and extended efficiently."

Mr R Smith also spoke about the potential difficulty in providing additional storage and that Council would have to pay for ongoing repackaging and rebagging of chemicals and there was the additional potential risk of contamination should a fire occur.

Mr Bush-King said that a staff letter would be sent back to respondents to say that Council cannot pick up the extra agrichemical items at this time.

Representatives of the Motupiko Water Augmentation team attended the meeting and made a presentation to Council on the planning and consultation progress made towards this project. The project team members present at the meeting comprised Edwin Newport, Tim Davies, Mark Dawson and Joseph Thomas. Andrew Fenemor was unable to attend the meeting. The augmentation team recommended that a prefeasibility study be carried out on the Horopito and Alan and Ben Gullies as potential dam sites. A community meeting was proposed to be held at Tapawera on 5 July 2007 at 7.00 pm.

10.1 Submitter V51.3443, KAK and K J North, 8 Edward Street, Richmond

Mr North made a verbal submission, as the owner of this heritage house, having an H5 rating in the TRMP. He sought that the existing fireplace be retained for use as an open fire. Mr North said that as there are only six such heritage houses in Richmond that there are hardly enough to create a problem in the Richmond airshed.
