1 PUBLIC FORUM

1.1 Mr D Gallagher

Mr Gallagher spoke briefly about amalgamation and proceeded to commend the Engineering Services Department for its ongoing work.

1.2 Mr A Walker – Grey Power Motueka

Mr Walker expressed concern about the increase in rubbish in the Motueka township area. He asked that there be more rubbish bins installed and that these be serviced on a regular basis. Mr Walker asked that Council remind its residents of the need to keep vegetation trimmed to ensure footpaths were kept clear of obstacles.

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1.3 Mr L Faulkner and Mr M O'Connor

Mr Faulkner and Mr O'Connor gave a PowerPoint presentation on the recent river protection work around the Motueka and Tapawera rivers. They expressed their concern about the indiscriminate removal of vegetation and suggested that crack willow should not be classed as a noxious weed.

Mr Faulkner spoke about the amount of silt flowing through to Tasman Bay.

3.3 Motueka Flood Control Project Report RESC11-06-03

Transportation Manager Mr Clark was in attendance to speak to the report contained in the agenda.

The purpose of the report was to provide information on the Motueka Flood Control project; provide the Committee with the outcomes of consultation at stage "b" of the process outlined in Section 78; seek the Committee's agreement to proceed to stage "c"; inform the Committee of future milestones connected to the Motueka Flood Control project.

It was suggested that staff arrange a visit to the area for Councillors and the Motueka Community Board.

 - c) When the reasonably practicable options are assessed and proposals developed;
 - d) When the preferred option is adopted; and
- 3. THAT the Engineering Services Committee notes that Tasman District Council staff undertook consultation on stage 'b', (in 2b above) on the reasonably practicable options for the project (in accordance with resolution RESC11-02-06 Motueka Flood Control), and that this report, RESC11-06-03 outlines the results of that consultation; and
- 4. THAT the Engineering Services Committee notes that Tasman District Council staff will now use the results of this consultation to feed into a report for consideration by the Engineering Services Committee which will assess the reasonably practicable options consulted on as part of stage (c) as noted in the report RESC11-06-03; and
- 5. THAT the Engineering Services Committee notes that a technical report on the Flood Control options will be presented to the Engineering Services Committee on 4 August 2011 as noted in the report RESC11-06-03; and
- 6. THAT the Engineering Services Committee notes that Tasman District Council staff will have undertaken further work on the matter of gravel extraction raised in the submissions and to report the impacts back to the Committee as part of the report in 5 above as noted in the report RESC11-06-03.

3.5 Mapua Water Supply – Temporary Lifting of Water Connection Moratorium Report RESC11-06-05

Utilities Asset Manager Mr Cuthbertson was in attendance to speak to the report contained in the agenda.

The purpose of the report is to advise the Committee about the leak detection surveys conducted in the Mapua/Ruby Bay water reticulation area, and subsequent repairs to the reticulation. The report also advised that an additional amount of water (up to 54m³/day) was now available for new water connections.

A discussion ensued and staff were questioned about the impact of the proposed Tasman Resource Management Plan Change 22, Mapua/Ruby Bay Development.

The matter was left to lie on the table.

Cr Wilkins left the meeting at 11.50 am.

3.6 Motueka and Pohara Water Supplies Report RESC11-06-06

Utilities Asset Manager Mr Cuthbertson was in attendance to speak to the report contained in the agenda.

The purpose of the report was to request that the Motueka and Pohara Water Supply areas be included in the Urban Water Club. The Motueka and Pohara Water Supply areas are currently individual closed water accounts.

A discussion ensued regarding the benefits of the Urban Water Club membership and staff reiterated comments made in the report relating to the historical installation of the water supply line from Tarakohe to Ligar Bay.

It was suggested that consultation be undertaken with the Motueka and Golden Bay Community Boards.

- 1. THAT the Engineering Services Committee receives the Mapua-Ruby Bay Water Supply, Temporary Lifting of Moratorium Report, RESC11-06-05; and
- 2. THAT the Engineering Services Committee approves the lifting of the present moratorium on the Mapua-Ruby Bay Water Supply as noted in the report RESC11-06-05 so that a maximum of 54 m3 per day of water can be allocated to approved new water connection applications:
 - a) to allow all potential consumers on the Mapua-Ruby Bay Urban Water Supply waiting list to be allocated water subject to normal application and approval;
 - b) to allow consumers on the waiting list that apply for water that want a ruralrestricted supply are limited to a maximum of 1 m3 per day per lot, as noted in the report RESC11-06-05; and
- 3. THAT Tasman District Council reintroduces the water connection moratorium on the Mapua-Ruby Bay Water Supply once the 54 m3 per day allocation is taken up by new consumers as noted in the report RESC11-06-05.

A discussion relating to the potential impact of the proposed Tasman Resource Management Plan Change 22, Mapua/Ruby Bay Development on this matter continued.

An amendment was proposed by Cr Glover and seconded by Cr Bouillir.

The amendment was put and carried.

The amendment then became the substantive motion and on being put was carried.

 - a) to allow all potential consumers on the Mapua-Ruby Bay Urban Water Supply waiting list to be allocated water subject to normal application and approval;
 - b) to allow consumers on the waiting list that apply for water that want a ruralrestricted supply are limited to a maximum of 1 m3 per day per lot, as noted in the report RESC11-06-05; and
- THAT Tasman District Council reintroduces the water connection moratorium on the Mapua-Ruby Bay Water Supply once the 54 m3 per day allocation is taken up by new consumers as noted in the report RESC11-06-05.
