Richmond Water Treatment Plant Project

The Council is constructing a new water treatment plant on the corner of McShane Road and Lower Queen Street in Richmond. The new plant and associated pipework, which will cost approximately \$8m, will improve water quality to meet the New Zealand Drinking Water Standards.

Currently the water supply network for Richmond is divided into two supplies. One zone is fed from the Waimea bores via the Waimea Water Treatment Plant and Champion Road Reservoir, the other is fed from the Richmond bores and the Richmond Reservoir.

The new Richmond Water Treatment Plant (RWTP) will receive untreated water from both the Waimea and Richmond bores. The two existing Richmond supply zones will be maintained increasing the network's capacity.

Treatment at the new RWTP will include ultraviolet (UV) light and pH adjustment as well as blending the water from the two sources. A chlorine gas dosing system will also be provided, but will only be used as a backup during emergency conditions. The new RWTP will include two sets of pumps, one supplying the Champion Road Reservoir and the other supplying the Richmond Reservoir.

There are two main phases of work being carried out over the next 18 months.

First the Council will install a number of connections to the users along Lower Queen Street. This work will happen through a rolling programme of minor works between November 2013 to March 2014. Secondly, a number of new pipelines will be installed along Lower Queen Street, as well as the construction of the new RWTP, starting in March 2014. This work will cause some disruption to traffic, as well as having short periods when water supply is affected. There will be more information about this sent to those impacted as the work progresses.

Phasing the work by firstly doing the connections and then installing the main pipes means the Council can switch over to the new pipelines efficiently when the plant is complete in June 2015.

What are the benefits?

- Meet the new drinking water standard requirements.
- Security of water supply for Richmond.
- Fully utilising the urban allocations and being able to balance out the Waimea and Richmond supplies during times of drought.
- Quality of water will be improved by mixing the two supplies.
- Reduce the risk of contamination via ultraviolet disinfection.
- Processes at the new plant will mean there is no need to chlorinate.

Message from the Mayor

As the end of the year approaches it has been a pleasure to attend the prize giving ceremonies at some of the colleges in our District. The Ministry is holding a public meeting at Seifried Estate on 25 November 2013 and I urge those with an interest in the preservation of this allimportant resource to attend. Have your say on proposed freshwater management changes

In early November 2013 the Government, through the Ministry for the Environment, released a discussion document on proposed changes to the National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management. The proposals include a national framework to help regions set freshwater objectives in their regional plans, with national minimum requirements around the protection of ecosystems and human health.

National Policy Statements are binding requirements that Councils need to take into account and they effect related Council planning, including policies and rules. In this case a National Policy Standard has the potential to have an impact on the quality and quantity of water allocated across the Tasman District.

The discussion document is now open for public feedback. The Government will consider all submissions before it progresses the next stage of changes to the current National Policy Statement.

Abel Tasman Drive repair update

Over the past two years Abel Tasman Drive in Golden Bay, from Ligar Bay through to Wainui, has suffered a great deal of damage related to wear caused by the extreme weather events of December 2011. The damage and its effects is very noticeable in three places in particular, just below the Abel Tasman Memorial, the causeway between Ligar Bay and Tata Beach and on the Wainui Hill itself.

The \$2.5m slip remediation work on the Wainui Hill was split into two contracts with Fulton Hogan working on the Tata Beach end to the top of the hill and Solly's from the top of the hill to Wainui Bay. All major construction has been completed with only minor drainage, sealing and cleanup work to be completed.

On the Wainui side of the hill there are two sections of road that will remain one way. One area is the old slip above the road which has a name of "monsoon". It is still active and will be that way for some time. The other area much lower down the hill is a new slip above the road that will have material falling onto the road for a year or maybe two. By keeping it one way there will be room for any falling material to land without closing the road. When the slip settles the road will be widened out as a two-way road again.

To address the issues and provide a long term solution for the causeway the Council will construct a wider shoulder to support the road. This solution will require major construction as this is in an important coastal marine area. Resource consent is required prior to starting the earthworks. There is very little value in repairing the road without completing the required earthworks prior to construction in the interim.

If consent is not granted prior to Christmas, temporary repairs will have to be undertaken to cope with the increased holiday traffic. The ideal situation is for patience and for people to travel slowly through the site, as the faster traffic goes, the rougher the road gets.

Ligar Bay Hill north of the monument has been one way for some time due to a slip on the sea side of the road. It will stay one way for some time as the cost of installing a retaining wall is prohibitive as well as the risk of the remaining length of road on the sea side also failing. By keeping vehicles away from the outside edge the risk of future failures will be minimised until a long term solution is identified.

Big Beach Clean up

More than 600 volunteers were out in force on Saturday 9 November 2013 helping with the Big Beach Clean Up, removing three tonnes of rubbish from our regions beaches.

The Big Beach Clean Up is an annual initiative set up four years ago by the Department of Conservation, supported by Tasman District and Nelson City Councils and Nelmac. Over 300km of the Nelson/Tasman

coastline, from the Tonga Marine Reserve to Abel Tasman National Park was cleaned up with the help of volunteer groups that each 'adopted' a section of coastline for the day.

Tasman District Council's social club adopted Tapu Bay reserve. The section next to them, between the Riwaka River mouth and Tapu Bay, was cleaned up by Keep Motueka Beautiful and Forest and Bird.

River Control 2013/14 Season Spraying To Start

The Council will be undertaking ground based herbicide spraying to control woody and invasive weeds as per its usual annual programme in the fully maintained rivers, from November 2013 to April 2014 inclusive.

Rivers included are the X&Y river rated sections of the Waimea/Wairoa, Wai-iti, Eves Valley, Moutere River and Company Ditches, Upper and Lower Motueka rivers, Riwaka and associated waterways, Tadmor, Sherry and Motupiko rivers. In Golden Bay the rivers included are the Waingaro, Anatoki, Takaka, Aorere and Kaituna. Herbicides used will be Grazon, Glyphosate and Metsulfuron. The main purpose of the spraying is to maintain flood channel capacity hence woody weeds growing on islands and beaches in the fairway are the main target. Please refer to the Council's website (search 'river management') and the Council's 2013/14 river work programme for further details. 


