Community gathers at dawn for ceremony

Mayor Richard Kempthorne, councillors and staff joined community groups, iwi and members of the public before dawn to lay mauri stones at the site of Golden Bay's new recreation facility.

The stones represent the life blood of the facility and will act as kaitiaki, or guardians, offering protection and carrying the spirit of the community. The ceremony on 2 February 2016 preceded the start of construction. When complete, the facility will house a gymnasium with indoor netball court, two squash courts, toilets, changing rooms, and community and function rooms. The work is expected to be completed by November 2016.

Landscaping planned for Ligar Bay

A new walkway, plantings and picnic tables are planned for part of the Ligar Bay esplanade to make it an even nicer spot for picnicking and relaxing and to reduce sand dune erosion.

We'd like to know what you think of draft landscaping plans for the Ligar Bay esplanade, so check them out and fill in the feedback form at tasman.govt.nz/feedback.

What is planned?

- Creation of a crushed shell pathway. This path could link to the toilet block and beyond in the future.
- Construction of two carparking areas with dolomite chip surface and timber bollards to define the parking areas from picnic and reserve areas.
- Extension of Coastcare plantings along the beach-front areas to help stabilise the sand dunes.
- Establishment of low coastal shrub plantings to improve coastal habitat values along the stream sides and to provide a buffer between the reserve and the road.
- Installation of four additional picnic tables and a wood-fired barbecue.

We're hoping to carry out the landscaping in a staged approach over the next two to three years. There will be an opportunity for residents to be involved in the planting.

Take care around the water at Mapua

The currents can be swift at Mapua, so please keep yourself and your loved ones safe while enjoying the wharf area.

The redeveloped Mapua Wharf is proving an extremely popular summer destination. We're encouraging everyone who visits the area to make the most of the beautiful setting to picnic, relax and have a great time – but please do take care around the water.

We don't want anything to take the shine off your experience, so remember the currents can be dangerous. There have been a couple of near drownings recently, with a child swept under the wharf, and kayakers becoming trapped under the floating pontoon.

Keep a close eye on children around the water and the wharf.

Kayakers should use the boat ramp to launch from, not the floating pontoon jetty, as it's a safer launching spot without the strong tidal flows that destabilise kayaks.

The reinstatement of Queen Street will take place as part of a major stormwater upgrade to reduce flood risk. Second Hand Sunday returns

Second -Hand SUNDAY

Second Hand Sunday returns on 13 March 2016 – it's a chance to clear out some clutter or grab a treasure or two.

Introduced for residents of Tasman and Nelson in 2014, the event has proven a popular way for people to pass on unwanted items. In December 2015, more than 130 registered households took the opportunity to gift unwanted bits and pieces to others through Second Hand Sunday and 90 per cent said they would do it again, because it works.

The event will be held again from 10.00 am on Sunday 13 March 2016. Second Hand Sunday is supported by the Tasman District and Nelson City Councils.

What is Second Hand Sunday?

People taking part in Second Hand Sunday leave unwanted items on their driveway for others to take away for free. Goods can include anything from old furniture, books, clothing or leftover bits and pieces from building projects. We ask people not to put out food or dangerous goods such as faulty electrical equipment, chemicals or firearms.

How do I participate?

To offer items, complete a registration form online by 9.00 am on Thursday, 10 March. Visit nelson.govt.nz or tasman.govt.nz and use the search phrase "second hand sunday". You can also register at any Council service centre.

On the day, put your items out on your driveway or front lawn and attach the downloadable poster (also available at Council service centres) to your letterbox so people can easily identify your address. Responsible removal of any uncollected items is required at the end of the day.

For treasure-hunters, the final list of addresses for those offering free stuff will be available on the Councils' websites from midday on Friday 11 March 2016.

Look for the Good Wood Tick

When you choose a Good Wood supplier, you're opting for a trusted source of dry firewood that will burn well, helping to keep your home warmer and our air cleaner.

Remember to clean your chimney annually too. Not only is this important to help prevent chimney fires, it will also help your wood burner run more efficiently.

Burning firewood with a moisture content of more than 25% is banned in Tasman and Nelson. Green wood that has recently been cut or wood that has not been stored properly or for long enough does not meet this requirement.

The Council's Good Wood Scheme participants have agreed to supply Nelson and Tasman householders with either:

- Seasoned firewood, suitable for immediate use during the winter months, or
- Green (unseasoned) firewood delivered sufficiently far in advance of winter so that, if properly stored by the user, it will be seasoned ready for use in the winter months.

When ordering seasoned wood from a Good Wood supplier, request that the wood complies with your Council's moisture requirements. If it doesn't, don't accept the delivery.

A Good Wood supplier will have a moisture meter to measure the moisture content of wood if you wish to confirm that wood being delivered is dry enough to use.

Alternatively, you can buy green wood in time for it to be seasoned before winter. Wood will take between four and 12 months to season.



Ensure that any green wood purchased is stored so that the air can circulate freely and is sheltered from rain.

Good Wood suppliers and your Council encourage people to buy wood in plenty of time before winter starts. Now is the best time to buy.

Remember to get enough kindling to help with starting your fire.

Do Not Burn Treated Timber

Timber treated with preservatives such as CCA (copper chrome arsenic treatment) must never be burnt. Burning treated wood exposes yourself and your family to its dangerous chemicals and the ash also causes long term issues in the environment. Arsenic is also released into the atmosphere when treated wood is burnt.

Monitoring our air quality has shown significant levels of arsenic in our wintertime air. The only source is treated timber from domestic fires.

You should also avoid burning painted timber. Some painted timber still has paint that contains lead and the lead will also enter the air through the smoke.

Please contact the Council if you are unsure whether the wood you are burning is treated. Treated wood offcuts should be sent to landfill.

Tasman Resource Management Plan Proposed Plan Change 60

Rural Land Use And Subdivision Policy Review

The Council has prepared amendments to the Tasman Resource Management Plan, known as Proposed Plan Change 60: Rural Land Use and Subdivision Policy Review.

This Plan Change reviews and updates the policy and rules for rural land use and subdivision. The proposed amendments ensure greater protection of productive capacity, allow for flexibility of use and maintain rural character – while offering greater choices for landowners.

Submissions

Any person may make a submission on any part of any of the proposed Change. Submissions can be sent to the Environmental Policy Manager, Tasman District Council, Private Bag 4, Richmond 7050 to be accepted by the Council until 4.00 pm on Monday 14 March 2016. Submission forms are available as indicated below under "Availability of Proposed Changes". Submissions must be in writing, clearly indicating support or opposition to the provisions, the decision that the submitter wishes the Council to make (with reasons), whether or not the submitter wishes to be heard in support of the submission and an address for service or contact address.

Consideration of Proposed Amendments

After submissions have closed, the Council will publish a summary of all decisions requested by submitters. There will be a further period of 10 working days within which further submissions in support of or opposition to those submissions made may be sent to the Council. The Council will then hold hearings on all submissions and all submitters may be heard. After the Council considers the submissions and makes its decisions, any submitter who is not satisfied with the decision has the right of appeal to the Environment Court.

The proposed amendments are available to view at the Council's Richmond office; Motueka, Takaka and Murchison service centres; Richmond, Motueka and Takaka libraries; or online at www.tasman.govt.nz/link/trmp-proposed-changes. Submission forms are also available.
