- June July 2017: Draft reserve management plan open for public submissions.
- September October 2017: Hearings and deliberations on the draft plan.
- December 2017: Final plan adopted by Council.

Initial phase of Queen Street upgrade begins

Work to upgrade a water pipe and install services in Queen Street is underway – a precursor to the major pipe and street upgrades to come in 2017.

Our contractor Downer has begun laying a small water pipeline on the library side of Queen Street, between Gladstone Road and Sundial Square, as well as installing communication and power ducts. Other work will involve moving above ground power boxes out of Queen Street wherever possible. This initial relatively minor job is the first phase of the Queen Street upgrade, in which ageing and undersized stormwater, water and wastewater pipes will be replaced and the street's surface reshaped to better control floodwaters. The street surface will be replaced to a new design intended to make Queen Street safer and more accessible for all pedestrians. The major infrastructure upgrades begin in February 2017.

Carrying out this smaller job first reduces the risk of disruption to water services during next year's works, and will allow the major upgrades to be carried out faster.

Some of the work is being done at night to minimise disruption to businesses and users of Queen Street. A small number of car parking spaces will be unavailable at times. Downer will be in touch with individual shops and properties to advise the details and timing of any water shutdowns needed to connect the new pipe.

Easter Sunday trading – yes or no?

Tasman and Nelson residents are being asked their initial views on Easter Sunday trading following a change in legislation.

From next year, local councils are expected to determine where and when Easter Sunday trading takes place. If the councils decide to allow Easter trading, employees have the right under the new law to refuse to work on Easter Sunday without giving a reason and without any repercussions from their employer. As it is not a public holiday, staff are not entitled to extra pay if they did work. Tasman Mayor Richard Kempthorne said both councils in our region had decided to ask the community for early feedback on whether it supported Easter Sunday trading before taking a position.

"We're keeping a completely open mind on the issue. Once we hear what people think, we'll decide whether to put together a more formal proposal."

Mayor Kempthorne said it made sense for the consultation to seek a consistent regional view.

Once the results are in and considered, we'll consider whether to do more formal consultation on a draft policy, probably from December through to February. That way if any new arrangements are made they may be in place for Easter next year.

Richmond road works and parking changes

A quick reminder about road works and parking changes in Richmond. Thank you for your cooperation and patience while we carry out this essential work.

New parking rules on Salisbury Road: The new Traffic Control Bylaw is now in place. Vehicles for sale are no longer allowed to park on Salisbury Road, and new P2 spaces have been introduced. Our goal is to keep students safe and improve traffic flow during peak times.

Wensley Road parking: By the middle of next week parking will again be available on Wensley Road between the Queen Street and Oxford Street roundabouts. We've nearly finished replacing old water pipes with larger-capacity mains.

Cambridge Street watermain: The next watermain to be replaced, later this month, is in Cambridge Street. Again there may be some short-term impacts on carparking. Parking is available in the Warring car park, including some all day spaces.

Queen Street works: Minor water works between Sundial Square and the library. See page 2 for more details.

Remember the Ring Road: Queen Street is surrounded by free parking – and a ring road. Most of the car parks connect to Queen Street via walkways. Next time you're visiting, try the ring road carparks for a hassle-free experience

Netball courts on track for construction at their new home

The new netball courts at the new Golden Bay Community Recreation Centre are the latest feature to make an appearance. Originally sited in the southern corner behind the rugby fields they are now sited on the western side of the centre.

Where did they come from and how did they end up where they did? Previously sited at Golden Bay Primary School, the courts became the home of temporary classrooms when the old classroom failed earthquake standards. After a while it became clear this was not going to be a short-

term situation and the Bay was down a significant number of netball courts. The development of the Community Recreation Centre provided a natural home with new courts. Unfortunately, the only land available at the time was also used extensively during the annual A&P Show. The Golden Bay A&P Society has come to the rescue and donated the land needed for the courts to the Centre; now the Council can design and deliver the courts in time for the Centre's opening. While the courts will be complete for use prior to Christmas this year lighting and fencing will feature in the near future.

A big thank you to the A&P Society for donating the land for the courts.

River weed control season starting 2016/17

To control woody weeds and riparian pest plants growing along our rivers, we operate a spraying programme November to April. We target broom, gorse, buddleia and wilding willows that, if left, will block river channels over time. Due to regular spraying since 2012 there are only relatively small areas within flood channels to control this season, so efforts will be focused on controlling pest vines in selected riparian areas (species such as old man's beard and chocolate vine). Areas to be targeted for this work include the Waimea and Wai-iti Rivers, the Sherry and Motupiko Rivers in the upper Motueka catchment, and the Lower Motueka near the township. Techniques will include backpack spraying, motorised pressure sprayers and cutting and painting as appropriate. If a river adjoining your property is to be sprayed, a contractor will contact you.

Short-term chlorination for Richmond's water

To safeguard Richmond's water supply while major supply pipeline work takes place, chlorine will be introduced into the water between 4 and 7 November 2016.

This is a temporary measure. Once the work is finished and the bacteria risk is gone, we will stop chlorination and the water will continue to undergo ultraviolet (UV) treatment as usual.

Will my water be affected?

The Richmond water supply covers the Wakatu Industrial estate and ENZA in the north, residential houses on the northern side of Champion Road (in the Nelson City Council area but serviced by Tasman District Council water supply) and all of urban Richmond, including the Beach Road area and as far south as Haycock Road. If you live in this area you will receive chlorinated water for this time.

I don't like the taste of chlorine - what can I do?

We suggest you fill clean bottles with water before 4 November 2016 and store them somewhere cool and dark in order to have unchlorinated water for drinking during this period. Alternatively, you can leave chlorinated water out in an open-topped container for several hours, then chill it, to reduce the taste of chlorine.

How long before the taste returns to normal?

It may take a few days after chlorination stops for the taste and odour of chlorine to disappear completely.

I have pet fish - can I top up their water?

If you have pet fish, remember to de-chlorinate the water first before topping up their tank or set aside some non-chlorinated water before 4 November. You can de-chlorinate by using a specialist chemical you can buy from most pet shops.

New grants fund open for applications

The programme is designed to encourage children to continue reading through the six-week summer holiday break. It's a fun way to keep the reading habit developing.






