It's been a glorious summer in Tasman District, although the extended dry spell early on has posed some challenges as well.

Swimming

We regularly monitor the water quality at popular swimming spots throughout Tasman District. Land Air and Water Aotearoa presents the information provided by councils nationally in a clear, easy to understand format. Visit www.lawa.org.nz to check whether your favourite spot is safe for swimming.

Mayor's Message

Hello everyone and welcome to 2018! I hope you were all able to enjoy time off with family and friends this festive season and were able to make the most of our beautiful Tasman District.

Once every three years the Council reviews what we need to deliver for our community and the costs associated with that. We call this process the Long Term Plan, and this year the Council will make decisions for the next 10 years, with a particular focus on the next three. We are preparing a consultation document for you to consider, which will be publicly available early in April. This process has taken a lot of preparation, but is very important to ensure our focus is on the right things for our community.

We must consider now what our generation needs to provide in terms of infrastructure and planning for future generations. Of particular focus is providing infrastructure to meet the needs of residential development, driven by the high level of population growth in our District. Safe and secure water supplies are a key ongoing focus for us. We need to look after the environmental health of all the rivers in our District and make decisions that benefit our whole community.

We really appreciate all the submissions that came in on the Waimea Community Dam funding and governance proposal. The Council will now take time to consider the issues that were raised. We will work towards making a final decision on whether or not the project proceeds in the first half of this year.

Finally from me, I'd just like to urge you to be particularly careful driving on our roads. I've noticed some very considerate driving, but we also need to be mindful of the occasional loon!

For now, enjoy the summer, look out for one another and stay safe.

Next steps for Waimea Community Dam

Deliberations on the funding and governance proposals for the Waimea Community Dam will be held on 1 and 2 February, with a decision likely in late February 2018.

Councillors will consider the 1,515 public submissions that were received on the proposals during the consultation phase between 21 October and 26 November 2017. Hearings were held in Richmond, Takaka and Motueka in mid-December.

A panel of technical and legal experts will be present at the deliberations to provide clarification on points raised in submissions, and to answer any questions councillors may have. The deliberations will generally be open to the public. The Council's decision on funding and governance is not the final go/no go decision for building the dam. Several other pieces of work must be completed before that decision can be made, including:

- Waimea Irrigators Ltd successfully raising their required financial contribution to the project
- · A firm construction tender price
- Confirmation of Nelson City Council's proposed contribution
- Final land acquisition and access agreements

- Confirmation of central Government funding – from Crown Irrigation Investments Ltd and Ministry for the Environment
- Finalisation of project contracts and legal agreements

Camping numbers limited at McKee Memorial Recreation Reserve

Pressure on some of our infrastructure at the McKee Memorial Recreation Reserve means we need to limit the number of campers at the site this summer. Most of the reserve is still open for camping, however please be aware we may need to turn campers away if the site gets too full and there will be a small area that is not available for camping. The sewage system at the reserve comes under pressure during heavy rain, so in the event of stormy weather please be aware the dump station could be closed at short notice. Alternative dump stations can be found at Hickmott Carpark, Motueka, and Fittal St, Richmond. The toilets may also need to be closed for short periods of time after rain. We apologise for any inconvenience this may

cause and thank campers for their patience while we work on a long-term fix.
