This report covers the month of June and July 2012. The website continues its steady and consistent performance.

Highlights

Peak visits on 2,499 recorded on Wednesday 6 June for a total of 9,392 page views. Peak visits of 2,618 recorded on Sunday 15 July for a total of 12,694 page views. Rain events are the likely cause of the spikes in traffic.

1. Commentary

The launch of the Library website displays the web presence the Council is building with a direct relationship between the look and feel of each facet ie Council, Library, facebook and twitter.

The Council's web team and steering committee are meeting, and often exceeding as reported in feedback, the service expectations of Tasman's online audience.

The past year's recognition has not meant a slow-down in the search for improvements with the next target being the increased use of the sites for engagement and online payments.

As displayed below the number of visits and time spent on the site is slowly increasing which could be attributed to a greater acceptance of the site as a means of interacting with the Council at the very least indicates a increased trust in the information provided.

Slow but steady growth is also being experienced with the Council's social media presence with gradual increases in numbers of followers / likes.



High Level Visitor Analysis


