EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Finance Report covers the two months, May and June 2012.

Within a predicted minor increase in expenditure through the use of radio and print advertising around the amalgamation debate, there were a number of minor increases in other lines due to refocusing of communications to communities.

1. Commentary

- 1.1 Communications expenditure as a whole for the year has finished under budget as indicated in earlier reports.
- 1.2 There are marginal overspends in some lines but again as earlier reported they are predominantly due to advertising with regard to the amalgamation debate earlier in the year.
- 1.3 There is also some reflection of the changes due to feedback received during that time regarding the best means of communication which has resulted in some increased expenditure, particularly in radio work.
- 1.4 The same period and expenditure mentioned above is however, balanced by the savings already apparent in the revised communication channels. This is particularly noticeable in the Newsline production costs and printing.
