SUBJECT: MINOR WORKS PROGRAMME

#### 1 PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide information on the Minor Improvements Programme for 2008/09. There have been a number of changes over the year and it is prudent to provide the Committee with the programme of works that will be completed this financial year.

#### 2 BACKGROUND

The Minor Road Improvements by NZTA has a current budget of \$874,000 and includes professional fees. The funding is subsidised by NZTA at a funding assistance rate (FAR) of 59%. This work category is very useful as it enables Council to undertake safety improvement works of a minor nature to a maximum value of \$150,000, without needing to undertake an economic evaluation. Often many of the sites have no crash history or this is very low however there may be a history of near misses. The sites are generally identified by both roading personnel and road users, and are situations or factors that pose a higher risk and thereby low cost solutions can reduce the chances of a potential crash.

The average cost of an accident including social costs on a road with a 100kph speed environment and regardless of vehicle type and movement ranges from \$23,000 for a minor injury accident to \$3,400,000 for a fatality.

Under the Government's Road Safety Strategy 2010 the goal is to bring New Zealand's road safety performance in 2010 up to the level already experienced by the safest countries in the world.

Projects are usually identified at the beginning of the financial year and are often in line with the Ten Year Plan expectations. There are changes that occur to the programme over the year due to costs, resource consent requirements and other issues. Accordingly the programme is modified to meet these requirements with new projects being adopted and other deferred. Council was provided with the expected Minor Works Programme in October 2008.

## 3 COMMENT

The table below reproduces the Minor Improvements Programme presented to the Engineering Services Committee in October 2008 and provides a status of these individual projects.

As shown above most of the projects have been completed that were set aside for the Minor Improvements Programme. A number of jobs were for design only with the estimates prepared to allow for future programming. Some projects have been put on hold and/or deferred. In addition to the projects above, other works were carried out to ensure Council committed the funds set aside for this activity and to gain full NZTA funding. The table below shows the other completed projects.

As shown there has been very good progress in addressing a number of issues on the Tasman District Council's road network. There are a number of projects that have been designed and are waiting for the new funding allocation for 2009/10 to start construction

work. It is expected that there will be a \$50,000 overspend on this activity which will be covered by a surplus in non-subsided works. This overspend will ensure that we gain all of the 59% subsidy from NZTA for the work area.

A new Minor Works Programme will be prepared for this financial year and presented to the committee for approval early in the new financial year.
