Report prepared for meeting of 18 July 2010

Welcome to today's meeting. Firstly I would like to thank Peter Thomson and the team involved in the flood relief in Tapawera. To the many locals, contractors and forestry companies that have pitched in to help out, your initial and ongoing assistance has been much appreciated by the community and by Council. I spent the day up that way yesterday (28 June) and while the wet conditions have not helped and many property owners have a huge amount of work to do getting their properties back in order, I came away feeling that there is still a huge amount of community spirit in these smaller rural communities. Something they should be very proud of.

The ongoing saga of stormwater issues in Collingwood is hopefully reaching a satisfactory conclusion for all involved and the latest offer by one of the landowners could help.

Jeff Cuthbertson and I recently spent some time investigating several stormwater issues in Motueka and Jeff will report on these at the next meeting.

After attending the Mapua draft structure plan release with Councillors and staff I was extremely disappointed with the media headlines. This is a draft document for consultation (and the result of an enormous amount of staff time in consultation with community groups and individuals). If, as planned, a Councillor had chaired this meeting we would have been able to answer many of the questions and better explained the process.
