SUBJECT: Mayor's Report

COMBINED MEETING

The mayors and chief executives of Kaikoura, Blenheim, Nelson, Tasman, Buller, Grey, Hokitika and West Coast Regional attended a group meeting at St Arnaud organised by Nelson City. Presentations from Police, Transit, and the Ministry of Social Services together with a full discussion on local government issues affecting our region was considered to be beneficial at least once a year.

THE LEFTIES

One hundred and seventy left handers, together with partners and supporters, attended a National Golf Tournament at Greenacres. I attended an official welcome on the evening of the second day. I cannot recall receiving so many favourable comments about our District from a group of visitors. A credit to Greenacres' management.

AIRPORT TOUR

While I am sure that the tours we have participated in have been valuable to those attending they have not been well attended. We have, as a result, deferred until later further tours until more time is available.

REGIONAL AFFAIRS

This meeting was addressed by W Donnally, CEO Transfund, who stated that a restructure of the organisation was still in progress. This has been initiated by political interference. The funding of \$1.5 billion is meanwhile not delivering a great deal of development. They, in my view, seem to be bogged down with a PC influenced planning process which is a serious impediment in the way of projects. Regrettably, Tasman District and Ruby Bay Bypass is one of many delays.

MAPUA BOWLING CLUB

Kathryn and I attended the official opening. The Patron, Tom Wiley and I cut the ribbon. Tom spoke at some length of the Club's progress from its formative years he is 100 years of age very shortly.
