#### **STAFFING**

Council has successfully negotiated a new Collective Employment Contract with the Public Service Association and this has been officially signed and back payments made. The two year contract will run through till July 2007.

# **LABOUR TURNOVER**

Tasman District Council has a remarkably low level of labour turnover. For the 2004/2005 year the labour turnover was measured at 2.5% and for the 2003/2004 4%. Some comparable figures from other Council are:

Manakau City 15% Dunedin City 11% Auckland City 13% Wellington City 18%

The low turnover figure for Tasman District Council reflects our very good labour stability and high retention of inhouse knowledge. Councillors will also be aware that there is a significant cost associated with staff recruitment and the hidden cost of training.

### SUBCOMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP

Following Council's discussion of Committee Structures in early November, Cr Henry has volunteered to step down from the Audit Subcommittee and the replacement is Cr Currie. Committee membership will be adjusted accordingly.

#### **OFFICES FOR MPs**

From time to time MPs ask for assistance in providing an office in our Service Centres for them to conduct interviews with constituents. I would view provision of such an office as assisting in the democractic process. However we need to make clear that this provision is available on request to all political parties who have members in Parliament.
