SUBJECT:	Tasman District Council Consolidated Bylaw Chapter 3: Control of Liquor in Public Places: December 2007

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to complete the bylaw making process in relation to the review of the Tasman District Council Consolidated Bylaw Chapter 3: Control of Liquor in Public Places: December 2007 (the Bylaw) correcting a small technical error in process, and to ratify a recent amendment of the Bylaw.

Background

- 1. The Bylaw came into being at the end of 2007 after a review of the previous 2004 Bylaw was undertaken. All statutory processes were met in relation to advertising the review and public consultation. A technical error occurred in the progression of the reviewed Bylaw and the motion relating to Councils acceptance in CN07/12/04 did not identify that version as a completely new bylaw, but treated it as an amendment of the 2004 bylaw. That technical error can be remedied by this current process.
- 2. The recent amendment to the bylaw has passed through the necessary statutory processes, and at the meeting of Council's Environment and Planning Committee on 20 November 2008 at which the motion to adopt the bylaw was passed. To complete the bylaw making provisions correctly, it is necessary that full Council ratifies that decision.

Recommendation

THAT:

1. COUNCIL ADOPTS the reviewed Tasman District Council Consolidated Bylaw Chapter 3: Control of Liquor in Public Places: December 2007 as intended in CN07/12/04;

AND

2. THAT COUNCIL RATIFIES the amendment to the Tasman District Council Consolidated Bylaw Chapter 3: Control of Liquor in Public Places: December 2007 as adopted by the Environment and Planning Committee on 20 November 2008 and detailed in report EP08/11/20.
