2. DURING THE MONTH

- 2.1 The CEO Review Subcommittee has met to consider applications and recommendations from the recruitment agency following the close of applications for this position. This has resulted in a 'long' list of applicants who will be interviewed in the week beginning 12 December. Overall, the Subcommittee was very impressed with the calibre of applicants, which totalled 48. The Subcommittee intend selecting two candidates to bring to a confidential interview with the whole Council in January before the final selection.
- 2.2 The Council will have received a briefing on the progress of the Lee Valley Dam during a Council workshop of 6 December. During December the Waimea Water Augmentation Committee (WWAC) have met with Council Managers and me in preparation for this briefing and in particular to address governance, funding and rating issues. The WWAC will also meet with the various water users in the proposed zone of effect, to provide an update on progress and put forward the preferred WWAC model, cost and possible rating implications. Council will need to begin its own community consultation process in early 2012.
- 2.3 Sadly, Harry Holmwood of Golden Bay passed away in November. Harry had been a very active member of the Golden Bay community and has made a huge contribution to his community.
- 2.4 Thank you to Kaumatua Andy Joseph, for leading a blessing on the carved Waharoa at the front of the Richmond Office, before it was taken down for storage, and also blessing the building works as they proceed. Thank you also to Andy for supporting the recent Citizenship ceremony here in the Council Chambers.

- 3.1 I have attached Nelson Councillor Gail Collingwood's summary of our joint visit to Christchurch in October. We were able to see both the effects of the Canterbury earthquakes in the red zone, Avonside and the Sumner cliffs area. We observed the progress that has been made towards clean up and restoration. This was a very impacting visit for many reasons. Media interest was high regarding our visit. It was incredible to think about the recovery operation that is now ongoing from Christchurch City Council, CERA and Government.
