TASMAN YOUTH COUNCIL

Summary of the Tasman Youth Council over the last 6 weeks:

Summer Passport

The summer 'Passport' is a mini-magazine packed with information including an event listing, the Late Late Bus route map and timetable, alcohol area ban map, and lots of safety tips, and information about the Nelson/Tasman region to help young people get the best out of summer. It has been put together and published by a partnership by the following organisations: Nelson City Council, Nelson Cancer Society, 93 MORE FM, THE EDGE 89.0, Nelson Bays Police, Public Health Service, Health Action Trust, and the Waimea cluster of the Tasman Youth Council. The 'Passport' will be distributed at secondary schools, shops, summer events, and local beaches.

Sounds of Summer – Tasman Youth Council ASB Aquatic Centre Gig

With the release of the passport, Youth Council decided to hold an outdoor music event to see in the start of summer and promote the passport. The event is going to take place on the grass area outside the ASB Aquatic Centre on Saturday 10 December from 2.00 pm—6.00 pm. The event is free, however if they wish to go swimming there will be a small charge with discounts on the day. On the day entertainment includes live bands (local young bands from Rockquest), volleyball, and information stands as well as people handing out health information and passports amongst the crowd. Security, HYPE workers and first aid workers have also been arranged. The youth councillors themselves have been very proactive in organising the event with minimal prompting from Community Recreation staff.

Youth Council Recruitment and Training for 2006

Good news is a number of this years youth councillors wish to remain on Youth Council next year. However we will have vacancies in some wards. Current youth councillors discussed the possible recruitment process for next year, and thought new councillors could be recruited by placing a light-hearted situations vacant style of advert, which would be circulated around via the school notices, mentioned at school assemblies, through teachers, youth workers, current youth councillors, the youth radio show on Fresh FM, and on school notice boards. Interested youth can come to an information session and then if they are still

interested they can submit a short spiel about themselves, and what interests them about youth council. In the new year we are looking at holding a training workshop with all the current and new youth councillors from the entire region. At the training we will be doing some teambuilding, looking at the role, and some of the tasks of Youth Council, and setting some goals of what they want to achieve for the year. Throughout the year each ward holds its own meetings and we will aim to hold a regional Youth Council meeting once per term for the sharing of ideas.

CREATIVE COMMUNITIES SCHEME

Grants are for projects which enable participation and/or increase exposure to the arts. Funds are allocated from Creative New Zealand on a population basis (2001 census) currently set at \$29,811.38 per annum, which are split into two rounds. NELSON TASMAN PHYSICAL ACTIVITY PLAN

The plan was approved at the October Community Services Committee meeting to go Stage Two – consultation on outputs identified subject to input from ward councillors. Input was received and added to the draft plan from Cr Tim King, Cr Elaine Henry and Cr Pat O'Shea.

The plan has also now being approved for Stage Two from Nelson City Council. The document is being prepared by Drycrust with submissions received till the end of January 2006.

THE CANTERBURY COMMUNITY TRUST

The application for support of the Boredom Busters Holiday Programmes was successful in gaining \$12,000.00. This supports the publication of the Boredom Busters Magazine and the funding for Holiday Programme Assistance Scheme. This scheme allows providers offering holiday programmes for 5-13 year olds to

apply for funding to maintain quality programmes and ensure costs are affordable.
