Two sessions for the public with authors were held in this time – Heather Hapeta, travel writer from Christchurch and Gerard Hindmarsh, well-known local author from Golden Bay.

Meetings were held with colleagues from neighbouring public library authorities. The Top of the South group (Nelson, Marlborough, Kaikoura, Hurunui and Waimakariri) met and agreed to continue to work together on their joint collection of talking books. Waimakariri have taken responsibility for making applications for funding for this project in this year. Tasman, Nelson and Marlborough also met with the West Coast District libraries – Buller, Grey and Westland. At both meetings the principle item for discussion was the proposed "One Voice" organisation which is intended to represent all public libraries in New Zealand. This proposal arose from the February public libraries summit and was strongly recommended by national bodies such as Local Government New Zealand. Library managers from all of New Zealand met in Rotorua before the LIANZA Conference on 9 September to endorse the concept of an Association of Public Library Managers. Feedback from regional meetings was incorporated in a proposed constitution and structure discussed at this meeting.

Staff members have been busy in this time with the revision of job descriptions for the Council-wide job resizing project and with the annual performance review process.

I have resigned as District Librarian with effect from 31 December 2007. The process of recruiting a suitable replacement is well underway in order to ensure a smooth transition.
