The following is an update on capital projects and items of interest.

### RICHMOND

Site	Projects for 2007/08	Timeframe
Jubilee Park	Irrigation	Work to commence in September weather depending.
Sandeman Reserve	Planting/working bee	This planting went very well with a large contingent of MWH staff attending. 1000 plants were planted, an interpretation sign on Estuary values was installed and a boardwalk constructed.
Washbourn Gardens	Begonia House	The Begonia House in the gardens suffered damage when the Douglas Fir fell on it. A structural Engineer is checking the house out and preparing a report.

The storm event on 30 July resulted in the loss of approximately 35 trees and shrubs and damaged fences.

## **MOUTERE – WAIMEA**

Site	Projects for 2007/08	Timeframe
Aranui Park	Pond development	The hard landscaping work has been completed, work is continuing on the soft landscaping and tree work.
Mapua Recreation Reserve	Path and Vehicle Barrier	A gravel path is to be put in to link Iwa Street with the village mall. Vehicle barriers are to be installed to keep cars etc off the Sportsfields and the root zone of the large trees.
Shuttleworth Reserve	Playground	The equipment for this playground has been ordered.
Two Rivers Walkway	Planting	A planting is to be held on the walkway river berm on 13/9/08 volunteers from the Brightwater Community Council will be assisting but extra help would be most welcome. This years Honda funding will be used to finance this project.
Kina Reserve	Maintenance work	Post and rope fences and sand ladders are to be installed in the reserve to help prevent pedestrian erosion of the coastal frontage. Tree work is also being carried out in the reserve.
McKee Recreation Reserve	Maintenance work/Toilet Block	Post and rope fences and sand ladders are to be installed at this reserve to help prevent pedestrian erosion of the coastal frontage. The new toilet block at the reserve has been completed.
Rabbit Island	Shade sails/Planting	The posts for the shade sails are in place ready for the sail part. Keep Richmond Beautiful planted 1000 spinifex plants on the front beach last week. SICON staff have planted the archaeological sites with natives and tree Lucerne.
Lord Rutherford Park	Meeting/social room	The construction of this building has commenced.
Moreland Place Reserve	Planting/development	Staff are working with neighbours to the reserve and a local community group.

Little Kaiteriteri / Stephens Bay Reserves	Coast care plantings Revegetation work	The planting bee was held on the 6 <sup>th</sup> September and was well supported by the local communities.
Linden Place Reserve	Survey/Development	The results of the development survey sent to residents have been collated. Residents generally supported the planting of nut trees on the reserve but not the removal of trees specifically to plant fruit or nut trees.
		It has been agreed to plant four nut trees and four Feijoa trees in the reserve, remove the pampas, shift the flax, install more picnic tables, start a Revegetation programme along the stream and remove one tree for arboricultural reasons.
Torrent Bay	Coast care planting	1500 spinifex plants are waiting to be planted on the beach with the local community once the sand replenishment project has been completed.
