SUBJECT: Community Recreation Advisor's Report

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on activities to the Committee on the Community and Recreation department.

RECREATION PROMOTION

Summer 08-09 editions of Mudcakes and Roses, Jam and Boredom Busters have been delivered. Inside Jam Mag is an online reader survey to gain feedback on the magazine. Boredom Busters publication has had to expand pages due to a busy summer holiday program schedule and an increase in holiday programs – including a new Lake Rotoiti Holiday Programme.

Hummin in Tasman is due out in the first week of December.

SPARC RURAL TRAVEL FUND

The fund is targeted at the travel costs of young people aged between 5-19 years participating in regular local sport teams' competition. There were five applications received to the October round.

THE CANTERBURY COMMUNITY TRUST

The application for support of the application for support of the Boredom Busters programmes and magazine to the September 20 Infants and Children's rounds was successful in receiving \$16,000.

The application for support of Community Events was submitted to the Recreation and Leisure round closing 20 November 2008.

This support from Canterbury Community Trust enables us to provide a range of programmes across the region.

MOTUEKA RECREATION CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT

We are anticipating notification this week of the result of the application to the NZ Lottery Grants Community Facilities Funds to support the Motueka Recreation Centre redevelopment. I hope to update the Committee today.

NUTRITION AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY (NPA) BASELINE HEALTH SURVEY

The phone survey of 1892 people across Nelson and Marlborough found they were significantly less likely to be overweight than the rest of the New Zealand population, they were also significantly more likely to be taking part in regular physical activity, and they eat more fruit. On the physical activity front, the survey showed that people finding the time to be active and road safety as barriers to being active.

The NPA team had just reviewed its strategic plan, in the light of the survey information with a strong emphasis on families and vulnerable people. The NPA Baseline Health Survey was carried out by the University Of Auckland Centre for Health Services Research and Policy and is one of the largest surveys of its kind ever done in this region, yielding information that is not available in nationwide government surveys which group Nelson Marlborough in with the whole of the South Island.

The NPA will be making the survey data available to schools, government agencies and community groups.

Some other interesting health points about people from the Top of the South:

- 78% eat breakfast every day
- 55% eat their main meal at home
- 70% have takeaways less than once a week
- 91% believe breastfeeding is ideal
- 16-24 year olds are the most active but also spend the most time sitting in the weekend
- More than 11% and 7% of people are walking or cycling to work or school
- 32% state time as the biggest barrier to being more active, followed by road safety 29% and health problems 26%
- 68% rate their health as good or very good
- Nelson Marlborough is significantly less likely to be overweight or obese than then NZ average.

WAY 2 GO

Pedometers now in every Library:

Way2Go pedometers have now been placed in every library in the Nelson Tasman district. The latest evaluation results from the Richmond library tells us:

- 80% of users report an improvement in Physical Activity levels following the pedometer loan.
- The largest group of users was recorded as over 60yrs of age.
- Key benefits reported were: feel good, feel healthy, lost weight, more movement, with some even changing eating habits as a result of using a pedometer.

Sit & Be Fit Workshop

Way2Go recently organised a Sit & Be Fit workshop at the Richmond Town Hall. 27 people registered with Way2Go funding 10 staff/volunteers to attend. Our aim was to empower more leaders to deliver sessions and so far we seem we have achieved this.

REPLAY (Recycled sport & recreation gear)

This is a programme being developed and driven by the Whakatu Rotary Club where second hand sport and recreation gear is distributed free to the community.

Rotary hope to target 'those who need it the most' and distribute to families who would otherwise not be able to participate.

They have just held their first collection drive and collected about 6 trailer loads of sporting equipment. Currently they are cataloguing, cleaning and repairing the gear getting it ready for distribution.

ARTS, CULTURE AND HERITAGE

The Draft Nelson Tasman Regional Arts Strategy has been released to the public for comment. These must be received by the 16 January.

TASMAN YOUTH COUNCIL

YouthFest

Tasman Youth were making their own stand on Election Day – a stand to celebrate being young and growing up in Tasman. Youthfest was held at the ASB Aquatic Centre live music and interactive activities (inflatable boxing, sumo and jousting games) 250+ attended.

Youth Council Breakup

Members from the Tasman Youth Council attended a Breakup Hui in Murchison last Saturday. The purpose of the end of year get together is to evaluate the success of this year's efforts, identify challenges facing TYC operations, share experiences, and reward the crew for all their hard work. A barbeque lunch, followed by white water rafting concluded the afternoon schedule.

Tasman Karaoke Superstars

Five regional heats have been completed and 30 finalists are about to compete at the Motueka A&P Show for the finals.

Murchison BMX park consultation

Consultation is about to get underway with the youth of Murchison surrounding the design of a BMX park. The installation of a new skatepark is considered to be unrealistic at this point in time, and as a compromise, a new BMX facility is a more achievable short term compromise. Murchison Youth are planning on presenting their case to the Murchison Sport, Recreation and Cultural Centre Executive Committee in December.

Tasman Skatepark Tour

Partners for the Tasman Skatepark Tour have been finalised. Along with Cheapskates and Village Cycles whom are sponsoring competition prizes, HYPE-GS have been recruited to provide youth work support throughout the tour. Radioworks sponsorship has also been added.

SUMMER EVENTS

Sundial Square Summer Sounds Series

A new event this summer is a joint initiative between the TDC and Richmond Unlimited and is to attract buskers into Sundial Square over the holiday season. The Sundial Square Summer Sounds Series will provide live lunchtime entertainment (12noon-1pm) starting 7 January, with performances including jazz bands, kapa haka, hip hop dance, solo guitarists, and children's theatre.

The following is an events summary which includes events coordinated and/or supported by the Community Recreation Department. The events are funded via Summer Festival budget or Community Grants, The Canterbury Community Trust Grant and community input and often voluntary time. A huge thanks to all involved who assist to make these events happen.

Events will be promoted on radio, in the Tasman District Council Hummin in Tasman and Newsline publications, as well as limited listings in the Sealord Summer in Nelson brochure. The Hummin in Tasman event list has been complied by the Community Recreation Department and includes events we are directly involved with as well as events from other event organisers. Copies are available from first week in December at TDC Offices, Libraries and at Information Centres and other community facilities.
