The following is an update on capital projects and items of interest.

RICHMOND

Site	Projects for 2008/09	Timeframe
Washbourn Gardens	Pond Upgrade	The hard landscaping part of the project is complete. New grass has been sown and landscaping will be carried out in the next few months. It is well worth a visit as the altered shape has made a significant change to the area and the viewing deck makes duck feeding a lot easier.

Richmond Cemetery	Memorial Wall	Construction of the Richmond Rotary Club memorial wall project is continuing with the walls now in place.
