Over summer I have had the opportunity to attend a number of community events such as the Takaka A&P Show, Tapawera BGAC Show, Opera in the Park and the Murchison A&P Show. It is always great to see the communities support for these events and, in particular, at the Murchison Show and how well the new ground layout and sports centre works. Over the weekend I attended the opening of the Murchison BMX track. We now have a premium BMX track in Murchison on the recreation reserve and the dressage arena is still under construction.
