1.3 The NZ Lottery Grant Board have confirmed that they will fully fund the Motueka District Museum Conservation Plan fee not to exceed \$11,405 plus



GST. Preparation of this will begin early in 2012 with conservator lan Bowman doing the work.

- 1.4 The Tasman Creative Communities Scheme closed on 10 November and received 22 applications requesting \$52,031 in grants. There is a total pool of \$31,775 allocated annually, from Creative NZ, and there are three rounds per annum
- 1.5 Peter Kenyon, motivational community enthusiast, facilitated a series of public and focus group meetings in Murchison between 13 and 16 November. The meetings were supported by the Tasman District Council Community Development Fund. The focus of the meetings were to highlight opportunities to stimulate community and economic growth in Murchison. The workshops were well attended with in excess of 200 individuals over the three days. The focus was on maximising use of the facilities like the Recreation Centre and the school, promoting the points of difference like the white water sports and increasing resident population. This is the first step with groups being formed around specific projects including the following:

Heated swimming pool

- Convert current school pool into all year use through heating
- Increase health benefits (especially for seniors, people with a disability)
- Help with pre schools with swimming river safety
- Includes lifting aids for people with mobile challenges and a water slide

Arts space

- Arts 'drop in' and arts learning/sharing/teaching facility
- Re use of RSA hall
- Place for sharing/conversations, skills exchange
- Place for selling crafts/art gallery
- Community space for all, especially those at risk

Murchison as the playground capital of New Zealand

- Make Murchison a family destination/stopping place
- Develop a world famous playground facility possibly in Monahan Park
- Study of other town's playgrounds from around the world
- Real adventure playground rivers, mountains, hunting, fishing
- Recreation Centre open and available for casual users

Community asset mapping (people, physical assets, networks, connections, ex Murchison young people, local stories etc)

- Form an action team to audit/map all the assets/resources/capacities of the community
- Link the assets and identify windows of opportunities



Create more walks / trails around Murchison


- Expand options for walking/cycling/horse riding
- Dog walking trails
- Create an exercise trail with exercise stations
- Form action team to identify options
- Negotiate with stakeholders
- Prepare plans
- Instigate working groups
- Prepare maps
- Identify funding/sponsorship

Create community garden and promote the idea of edible gardens

- Create healthier lifestyles
- Community working together
- Family involvement
- Food security
- Teach young people about food

2. RECREATION PROGRAMMES

- 2.1 The Richmond and Motueka based **street ambassador summer 2011-12 service** begins this weekend. A team of experienced youth workers will roam the CBD streets (and provide outreach to our satellite communities) during Friday and Saturday evenings over December and January. The service is to be once again provided by the not for profit youth organisation HYPE-GS, whom will also partner up and assist at upcoming community events such as the Tasman Skatepark Tour, Takaka Mardi Gra, Motueka Starlight Parade, and Last of the Summer Fayre.
- 2.2 The Tasman District Council supports the Late Bus service with an annual allocation of \$10,000. The Bus runs between Richmond and Nelson from 10.00 pm to 3.00 am on Friday and Saturday nights. The graphs shows weekend usage ranges from in excess of 400 passengers in late November to less than 10 in late April. Average use is in excess of 150 per weekend.





3. RECREATION EVENTS

3.1 The Motueka A&P Show is to host the **Tasman Karaoke Superstars** 2011 Grand Final this weekend. Twenty four premiere pop star wannabe's, spread across three age groups, will take to the stage for one last time. During the last three months, five regional heats have taken place, with over 100 competitors involved in the search for Tasman's next karaoke superstars.

4. RECREATION PUBLICATIONS AND PROMOTION

- 4.1 Hummin in Tasman summer guide publication was released on 14 November. The publication is a showcase of what the Tasman District offers for locals and visitors over the summer months.
- 4.2 A Boredom Busters survey has recently been conducted and the results relay positive support of the magazine. From those surveyed:
 - 86% regularly bring home copies of BB
 - 73% regularly look at Holiday Programme information in BB
 - 51% regularly use BB as a guide to daily holiday activities
 - 66% believe the BB format should stay in the current hardcopy magazine



- 30% believe a BB website should be created in addition to the hardcopy magazine
- Competition entries should be accepted via email
- The magazine should include more puzzles and activities.

4.3 Jam on Line is attracting (on average) 300 site visits, and 1000 page visits per month. Twenty four feature articles have been submitted by a variety of young people since the websites launch in May.
