SUBJECT: RESOURCE POLICY PROJECTS UPDATE REPORT - EP07/11/07

- Report Prepared for 15 November 2007 Meeting

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report provides an introduction to the work programme for resource policy development for the information of new members of the Committee, and a three monthly update on the progress with current resource policy projects for the information of members.

2. RESOURCE POLICY PLANNING

The Resource Management Act 1991 provides for a rather complex structure of planning for sustainable resource management. As a unitary authority, the Council has both regional policy statement, and regional and district plans to prepare and develop. Since shortly after the Council became a unitary authority in 1992, the Council has committed to an integrated, single combined regional and district plan, the Tasman Resource Management Plan (TRMP). The TRMP has been in effect for over 11 years, has undergone 64 formal amendment sets, called variations, each subject to public submission, decisions and appeals. Most of the content of all parts is settled, even though the TRMP as a whole is still "proposed". This status will not change to "operative" until each of the six parts is finally approved by Council. The approval of the land part (Part II) is scheduled for early in 2008, following the resolution of a key outstanding appeal.

The Tasman Regional Policy Statement has been operative for six years, and its continuation separate from the TRMP is a question to be examined following staff advice next year. That is because the Council could elect to combine this planning document with the TRMP.

The attached table describes in outline, the programme of projects for 2007 / 2008 and beyond, and covers process steps, current situation and next steps. Project-specific budgets and numbering awaits the complete rollout of the job costing system.

The scope of resource policy planning is broad, covering urban and rural land use, and coastal marine, rivers and lakes, water, and contamination management. Projects usually require issue investigations, options assessment and drafting phases before any variation or change is notified for submissions. The RMA First Schedule directs the plan development process after notification. Most projects are current, but some are listed but yet to start. The programme includes projects and priorities adopted last in August 2007. As with previous reportings, it is open for the Committee to review or confirm the listing of priorities or timings of projects.

4. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee receive this report.
