SUBJECT: RESOURCE POLICY PROGRAMME UPDATE - REP10-07-03-

Report prepared for meeting of 1 July 2010

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report provides an updated resource policy programme description and briefing on the current and likely situation with present and programmed projects.

2. BACKGROUND

In December 2009 the Committee last considered the resource policy programme (EP 09/12/02 refers). Since December 2009 the following key achievements have taken place:

- Agreement for resolution of last plan appeal for Change 8 (eastern Golden Bay)
- Richmond West DA Change 10 appeals mediation programme commenced.
- Proposed Part IV (Rivers & Lakes) as package of variations and a change notified December 2009, submissions summary in preparation.
- Plan Change 16 on cultural heritage sites management submissions summary ready for notification.
- Water allocation reviews Moutere and Motueka catchments decisions notified
 19 December 2009 and three appeals received; mediation programme to commence.
- Draft plan change for Richmond East development area feedback received and under assessment.
- Two geohazard risk draft changes (active faults and slope instability) that update the provisions released; feedback received and under assessment.
- Takaka -South Takaka urban development: draft structure plan paused while Takaka floodplain modelling and risk assessment completed

As in December 2009 the outlook for the rest of 2010 and beyond is for further progress on a large number of priority 1 projects. These are shown in the updated resource policy programme appended to this report.

3. PRIORITY PROJECTS

We continue with a large number of priority (priority 1) projects. We are still under capacity at present as two staff have either been on extended leave or are now part-time. However the 2010/11 annual plan has enabled the recruitment of an additional planner for the resource policy section. But projected staff time budgets within the resource policy section, and the availability of key staff and related investigations work in other departments, on which progress relies, mean that priority 1 projects remain more than we can adequately advance and commence all together.

An achievable programme for the rest of 2010 and for 2011 is to continue advancing current or live projects, as well as the targeted commencement or recontinuing of:

- Brightwater and Wakefield projects (Nos. 18, 19); (yet to commence) as available staff are committed to other live projects. We expect that this can be scoped for commencement in 2011
- Golden Bay rural landscape and settlement work (No. 10) where a contractual commitment applies to progressing to a plan change by end 2009 for at least coastal landscape matters. This work has been paused since mid 2008, and is programmed for recontinuation from July with reduced process steps and to achieve a notified change by July 2011 for at least the landscape component.
- Marahau to Kina (No. 39) as the same type of project as No 10 currently with contractual commitment to deliver by end 2010. This timeframe will not be achieved.
- Eastern Golden Bay for the Pohara Tata urban area (No. 9) where the drivers are Port Tarakohe development and infrastructure links, and dealing with lifestyle development demand in a visible and sensitive coastal landscape more strategically than historical planning decisions from the 1990s. This work is linked with the landscape aspects of project 10.

Other longstanding priority work includes the rural policy review, with work having been deferred for nearly four years pending the operative plan. Currently with staff committed in urban strategic work, there is limited capacity to at least scope this project for some months. For this reason this was signalled as less than priority 1 in July. However, it is hoped we can bring a re-scoped project to the Committee for approval by end 2010.

A further project signalled in December 2010 as priority 2 is the fate of the Tasman Regional Policy Statement. This planning document becomes due for review in July 2011. A report on its staged combination with the TRMP or other options is needed this year in order to confirm a process plan otherwise for this review.

4. **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Committee:

1. **Receive** this report and **note** the capacity limitations and priority project commitments for 2010/11.
