



Council's media monitoring service is provided by Meltwater, the leading global online media monitor accessing over 162,000 online publications as they are published.




Over the last month the phrase 'Tasman District Council' has been mentioned 65 times, across 18 publications.






Meltwater measured the 'sentiment' of those 65 mentions as being mostly positive (on average)




Below is a breakdown of the number of times the phrase 'Tasman District Council' has been mentioned in the media over the past three months. As you can see – there has been a general increase but nothing significant.

Conclusion:

The Council's media coverage at present is 'steady and fair'. By that I mean that there have been no sensationalist stories running in the key local media regarding the council, press releases sent out by the Council have been picked up and reported on accurately and relations with the local media and reporters is good. The level of media coverage the council is currently receiving is as would be expected for this time of year and political cycle. There are no media related concerns to report on at this time.
