We will have our appeal already submitted by the time of this meeting and we now have to wait for the subsequent hearings and decisions of the Local Government Commission.

On Friday 22 September it is proposed that a group of about 30 students with teachers and Board members engage in the not very glamorous but essential job of cleaning up the litter from the street berms.
