#### **Poster Towers**

Further to my last report that we had received an estimate for the construction of a poster tower for \$700, I have now received advice from Mike-Tasman Jones of Community Services that his Department would pay \$500 towards the cost.

I would estimate the installation costs added to the construction to be a few hundred dollars so if the Community Board wishes to meet the balance from its discretionary fund I can get the tower hopefully up before Christmas.

I will need a Board resolution and suggest balance funding up to \$500 be made available from the discretionary fund

## Staff Briefings

## Cycle Training (Life Cycle Courses)

Road Safety Coordinator Kirsty Barr asked that the following be brought to the Board's attention.

Just to let you know about when and where free cycling courses are happening in the Tasman District. Courses are held regularly in Nelson/Richmond and some set dates have been given for Motueka - details as below.

Golden Bay has already had their course.

Courses are not just for people who are starting out with cycling (although beginners are catered for). Marianne is an excellent bike mechanic and gives some great advice on basic bike maintenance as a part of the courses held in Motueka and Golden Bay. The next series of maintenance courses for Nelson/Richmond folk will be early in the new year.

Courses are free, all you need to bring is your bike and helmet. The courses are designed to help give confidence to adults returning to cycling later in life and while there is no age limit, the course is for adults rather than children (for information on cycle courses for children through your school, please contact Kirsty or your local police education officer).

Courses give practical help with cycling such as balance, working gears, seat height, slow maneuvering, as well as guidance on puncture repair, chain replacement and basic maintenance.
