SUBJECT: Motueka Resource Management Strategy

(MOST) → 2030 – a long term major planning

Strategy over two years.

#### a) Issues

urban growth for Motueka, Riwaka, Kaiteriteri, Marahau

- rural-residential opportunities
- protecting productive land where practical
- commercial and industrial growth opportunities
- infrastructural issues:
  - o roading and traffic management
  - wastewater
  - stormwater
  - rivers and streams
- maintaining the coastline and coastal character
- maintaining the western and northern landscape vista

#### b) Process

- November-December 2007 initial discussion between Motueka Community Board and Tasman District Council on the scope, issues and direction of MOST.
- Motueka Community Board (including Motueka Ward Councillors), Engineer, Planner form MOST Committee to prepare a discussion document
- July/August/September three months of public discussion and consultation
- October 2008 March 2009 "Draft" plan prepared.
- April 2009 June 2009 public consultation on "Draft"
- July 2009 September 2009 a "final" plan prepared
- October 2009 Notification of Variation to TRMP

## **Motueka Resource Management Strategy (MOST)**

- wonderful natural environment; near the river and by the sea
  - o Marahau, Kaiteriteri, Stephens Bay
  - Abel Tasman National Park
- encourage excellent urban design
- community amenities: retail, business
- recreational facilities: places for people to relax, perform, enjoy

- concentrate growth:
  - o low rise, medium density in central Motueka
  - o productive versatile soils
- transport issues:
  - o bypass for SH 60
  - o streets, footpaths, cycleways, pedestrian linkways
  - o public transport
- colour in the town and along traffic avenues
  - street furniture
  - street cleaning
  - o street lighting

## **Motueka Town Features**

- Entry to Motueka: a landmark feature?
- Airport and Motueka Port
- Motueka Recreation Centre and adjacent parks and estuary
- Thorp's Bush; Fearon's Bush; Marchwood Park, North Street Reserve, neighbourhood parks
- Maximising Deck's Reserve: car parking, shops facing, green space
  - Developing this area as an active public amenity
- Central Reserves: Memorial Park, Parklands grounds, Motueka High School grounds, Sportspark. An important central and large green space in the centre of Motueka.
- Golf course maximise the river: cycle/walkway
- Water features: coastline, estuary, waterways Thorp's Drain, Woodlands Canal

#### Recommendation

- a) That the Motueka Community Board initiates discussions with the appropriate Council Managers and Policy Planners to develop the proposal;
- b) That the issues and process (as outlined) be brought back to the Community Board at its December 2007 meeting, consequent on the discussion with the Council officers.
