There is a proposal regarding a reticulated water and fire fighting supply for Takaka in today's agenda. As you will see this may be a one-off chance to reticulate Takaka and we need to ensure that we discuss the opportunity with the Golden Bay Community Board, the Fire Service and the community. We need to ensure that we get the correct facts out there, rather than fiction.

I am pleased to advise that TDC and NCC were one of three finalists for a recent SPARC Cycle Friendly Award for the "Life Cycle Courses: Of Course you can cycle" project in the category of: "Cycle-friendly commitment by a public organisation". Unfortunately, the project didn't win but just to get to the finals is a great achievement and I congratulate Kirsty Barr and her colleague at NCC.
