A second open day will be held at TDC on 31 July (2-7pm) and I will update the committee on this event at the meeting.

I have some concerns over how long it may take to get through the process of getting a regional strategy in place and there may be considerable benefit for Tasman to go back to having its own Regional Land Transport Strategy.

It is a pleasure to be part of a Council that have not turned this topic into an election issue or to grandstand on. I also note there have been no letters to the editor from Tasman Councillors.

Takaka Firefighting Supply

There appears to be a number of suggestions being made as how to provide and fund this activity. We need to progress this issue urgently before more rumours and misinformation is spread around Golden Bay. It is amazing how something that was asked for by the community has clearly divided it. I suspect that at the end of all this the subsidised option may still have been the most affordable.
