Golden Bay A&P Assn: Contributions to the Recreation Park

In 1959 the A&P Assn and Athletic club gifted the entire grounds and buildings at the Golden Bay Recreation Park to the Golden Bay County Council, now the Tasman District Council. In return, Council and the A&P Assn resolved that the A&P Assn had the right to hold their annual show free of charge, in perpetuity and under the same conditions as it was then. Nothing more - nothing less.

For nearly sixty years the A&P Assn and Council continued an unhindered and amiable relationship with Council and the Community.

In 2016, to assist with development of the new recreation Centre, the Assn gifted further land to allow construction of two netball courts, paid \$4,600 to have the power put underground and made a substantial cash donation to the new facility [no strings attached].

This was a genuine gift to further enhance the Community w	ell-being at
the park and done in a spirit of goodwill.	

Since then, the Assn has been treated with utter contempt by the Golden Bay Shared Recreation Facility (GBSRF). In fact we have never been thanked by the Rec Park Board — quite the opposite — the previous Chairman stated to the Env Court that "the netball courts were relocated to the benefit of the A&P Assn".

GBSRF, backed by Council, now require our Assn to pay a \$500 levy to use the facility [facilities we previously had in our booth & grandstand] plus hire of floor tiles, display screens and dividers, plus fees for the days preceding and after the show. The land gifted just over a year ago forms part of the grounds we are now expected to pay a levy to use!

The A&P Assn is entirely voluntary and we barely break even with our takings. These new charges, plus Court defence costs, now put our show in jeopardy. The very fabric of Community is being pushed off the Park, affecting businesses, farmers, exhibitors, tourists and locals alike.

Dear Richard,

I refer to the Local Government (Community Well-being) Amendment Bill 2018 and the CEO's report RCN18-05-07 tabled at Councils meeting of 24 May 2018;

Page 225 of the report Council states - "We are about creating places and the emotional connections that people feel about the places they live, work, and invest in. Every community is unique and has differing needs and preferences. Councils can only reflect that uniqueness and meet those differing needs and preferences by taking a "community well-being" approach to our work with our communities".

Council recommends to Government that it - "supports Part 1 of the Bill to reinstate community well-being" and further "recommends s11A be replaced by a provision that councils consider how they may enhance <u>all</u> aspects of the livability of communities".

The Golden Bay A&P Assn hosts the biggest one day event in Golden Bay and is part of the very fabric encompassed in the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA). Not once has Council sat with the A&P Assn committee to discuss our long term agreement to hold our annual show unimpeded or to discuss the 'expired' lease of land for car parking. Rather, since the inception of the new Recreation Facility, Council has been deceitful and used bullying and personal attacks on committee members which not only contradicts the LGA but has undermined the goodwill our Assn has shown for many decades. We have also been hurt financially and our once amiable relationship with Council has suffered greatly through this debacle.

The A&P Assn requests you explain;

a. why Council supports the 'community well-being' message on paper but refuses to adopt these principals in practice, and

b. when will Council be prepared to sit and discuss 'how can we support the A&P Assn' instead of just backing the Rec Centre in everything they say and do. After all, the park is 'one place for all'.

"Lest We Forget" Not just on ANZAC day No But Everytime we Walk up the Step's and meet Friend's New, Young & Old .



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
